#### CARE OF YOUR CHILDREN

By ANGELO PATRI

A group of "small children, gathered from a child district in a great city and put in one class for instruction, were given a careful physical examination. During the tests it was found that almost every boy and girl in the group was hard of hearing. The defects ran up the scale from a slight defect in one ear to almost total deafness.

Small wonder that this group of children had not progressed in school. They had never heard words clearly. They were buried sounds at best, meaning less sounds at worst, and the result was general backwardness, poor behavior, failure.

**Has Depressing Effect**  
Failure that has become habitual has a depressing effect. It makes the child sad and sad children check his growth, of any kind whatever. It sets him apart from his fellows and that creates a mental attitude that affects his health, his growth and behavior. A hard-of-hearing child cannot share in the life of the other children, try as he may, unless he is shown how and helped to make the necessary effort and adjustment.

Most of the hard-of-hearing children can be helped to hear better. All of them can be trained to do some useful work and most of them can be taught ordinary school lessons to a passing standard if their condition is understood and provided for.

In most of the schools of the country, the hard-of-hearing child is seated near the teacher, and once in a while she remembers him and tries to help him. That helps but much more is needed.

**Specialized Training Needed**  
The very best child should be treated and taught by an expert trained for that work. The usual school teacher is trained for the instruction of the normal child and cannot, even if she wishes, help the defective child successfully. She has not the time nor the opportunity apart from her lack of training.

In every school district in every

town of any size, there should be at least one classroom set apart for the teaching of defective children. The hard-of-hearing children should be grouped and sent to that room where a teacher, a specialist in the instruction of the deaf, would teach them how to listen, how to understand, what the others said to them.

These children should not stay all day, every day, with the teacher, specialist in a class of defective children but have the opportunity of working daily with the children together for the hard-of-hearing child. In this free kind of our A.L.D. children count and that means the hard-of-hearing, the non-speaking, ALL of the People's children.



## STANTON FUNERAL RITES AT JEROME

JEROME, Feb. 4.—Impressive last rites for Judge Clark T. Stanton, 85, one of Idaho's most colorful politicians, were conducted here in Holy Rosal church Tuesday afternoon. Officiating at services was the Rev. Albert E. Martin, former pastor of the Methodist church. Mrs. E. E. Comer, played, and pianists were George D. Pettie, mayor; Frank M. Reilly, William R. Groves, chief of police; Paul R. Riegan, historian and Sen. S. L. Thorne, all members of the Jerome city council. The Rev. Martin officiated at the graveside. Stanton, who had lived in Idaho more than 60 years, served the city as police judge for several years and died at his home here last Tuesday morning, Feb. 1. He had been ill only since mid-December. He was born in McHenry county, Ill., Oct. 7, 1858.

The family came in 1878 and established a home near Hooty Bay, then a booming institute town. Young Stanton's father talked to him and his family was sold of the property in Hooty Bay. Judge Stanton engaged in farming at Hooty Bay, came to Jerome in 1908 and continued his business of contracting and building. Elected in 1928 as graduate judge of city court, he served three terms. During the first World war he was elected marshal of Jerome and for many years was a vice president of the American Iron and Steel Council. In early years he was active in finance work, filling an office in that organization in Connecticut. He was a staunch Republican and was an ardent admirer of the late Sen. William E. Borah, with whom he had become acquainted in Idaho at the time the senator was a circuit judge.


