STUDY OF PRESS FREEDOM SLATED

CHICAGO, Feb. 28 (AP)—A commission of inquiry has been formed to conduct a two-year study of the status of freedom of the press in the United States. President Robert M. Hutchins of the University of Chicago announced Monday.

Hutchins, who will serve as chairman of the group, reported the inquiry was made possible by a grant of funds from Time Inc. publishers of Time, Life and Picture magazines. But he said "Time" Inc. would have no connection with the commission, and added that it also would be independent of the University of Chicago, which will administer the funds. The amount of the grant was not disclosed.

Hutchins said in a statement: "The commission plans to examine the areas and circumstances under which the press in the United States is surviving or failing, to discover where free expression is not limited, whether the constitutional responsibility provisions of law, or advertisers, the protection of its own properties or the reaction of its managers."

Hutchins said the group hoped to hear "testimony on these questions in operating a free press from publishers, editors, top executives, research associates, advertising and circulation executives and readers. The result of the study, he added, would be a report on the status of press freedom."

Headquarters and a research office will be maintained in New York.

HUGE FARM LABOR PROGRAM DRAWN

DENVER, Feb. 28 (AP)—Increased farm production goals over 1943 combined with the drainage of farm workers to the armed forces, and war industries, will necessitate the greatest farm labor program in history, Washington farm labor officials said Monday.

They spoke at a three-day conference of state extension supervisors and farm supervisors from 11 western states to discuss 1944 farm labor.

To obtain a labor force of more than 12,000,000 at the peak of the nation's harvest will require the recruiting of about 4,000,000 seasonal workers by the U. S. crop corps community mobilization campaign, said Col Philip G. Branton, labor officer of the war food administration. George W. Hill, chief of the program branch of the W.F.A. labor officer said, "It is now evident that the armed forces are ready for a knock-out blow and more for one are needed. It is not time that so important a food production as we should be so far from the labor shortage."

The W.F.A. office of labor plans to maintain this year a force of about 30,000 workers which can be shifted as they move to save crops on seasonal labor shortage.

Hill said he anticipated the importance of around 25,000 Mexican nationals under international agreements and up to 20,000 Japanese-Americans will be used.

WASHINGTON CALLING

A PENETRATING NEW COLUMN ON NATIONAL AFFAIRS

Sound and temperate, bolstered always with unassailable facts gleaned from sources accessible to few outside of official circles, Marquis Childs has a national reputation as a top-notch reporter covering Washington and as a commentator whose outlook is cheerful and whose criticism is penetrating and constructive.
