PEARL HARBOR, March 31 (UP)-~A powerful American fleet, spearheading the greatst coordinated offensive of the Pacific war, was believed today to have wrecked Japanese bases within 460 miles of the Philippines in heavy attacks that still may be continuing on the Palau islands.

Failad Islands. While American battleships, carriers, cruisers and destroyers were making their deepest penetration of Japanese waters since the fall of the Philippines, U. S. bombing fleets from southwest and central Pacific bases blazed a trail of flaming destruction through Truk and other enemy strongholds along an arc stretch-ing 2,600 miles from Palau to the eastern Marshalls. The naval force launched its assuult on Palau. Lobs miles west of Truk and nearly 4,000 miles southwest of Hawaii, at
