

Several weeks ago the Times-News called ttention to a deplorable condition that is leveloping along Snake river canyon—the romiscuous dumping of trash by thoughtless

promiscuous dumpling of trash by thoughties, individuals who apparently have no regard for scenic grandeur or its potentialities. It was pointed out that rubbish of every sort was being dumped helter-skelter along the north irm of the canyon at a point di-rectly overlooking Blue lakes and the Perrine ranch.

ranch. Because this is one of the locations selected for tourist lookouts on the proposed scenic inglaway along Snake river from Shoahone falls to Hagerman valley, it only means that nuch additional work will be required to lear the area of tin cans, broken bottles and what not.

While there is no evidence of continued tumping in that vicinity since the Times-News called it to the public's attention, it now develops that the rubbish-haulers have merely changed the scene of their activity.

In a conscientious attempt to offer a continuctive suggestion, the Times-News again rails this condition to the people's attention, urging that they demonstrate sufficient civic ride to bring this practice to an immediate

We also suggest that cities in this vicinity, state highway officials and the boards of commissioners of Twin Falls and Jerome counties take definite steps to prosecute those individuals who refuse to comply with the law, who scatter their rubbish along the Canyon and highways instead of water the canyon and highways instead of using the dumpgrounds that are maintained for that

purpose.






