LONDON. May 3 (AP)-RAF Mosquitos, taking over the west phase of the European air war, made a 30-minute attack on the Ger-man chemical center of Leverkusen last night while Italy-based bombers blasted Genoa and communications centers in northern Italv

The 400-mile-an-hour Mosquitos dropped many 4,000-pound blockbusters in Leverkusen which lies just north of Cologne and is the home of one of the largest chemical works in Europe, employing 20,000 workers.
