portation.

In one respect, according to Mr. Hicks, we are fortunate in not having an elaborate airmort built according to plans that have been acceptable in the past. Many of such airports are now obsolete, he pointed out, and we have the advantage of starting from scratch on a modern layout that will meet air requirea modern layout that will meet un requirements.

He had nothing but praise for the approved plans for the up-to-date airport which Twin Falls hopes to build within the near future. If we now go through with these plans, Mr. Hicks predicts that Twin Falls will hold a key measurement of the system of the system of the system of future aviation.
