ROME SUBURBS Fifth Army Troops Drive Into Outskirts as Enemy Flees Crushing Assaults

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS, Naples, June 3 (AP) — American troops raced through Rome's outer approaches from the south and southeast tonight under orders to destroy the retreating German armies, five of whose 18 divisions already have been practically an-

minilated and whose defensive lines have been blasted apart. With the city's skyline in casy view of the advancing American armor and infantry, it appeared that within a matter of hours Rome might become the first European capital to be liberated from the nazis, Lieut. Gen. Mark W. Clark, commander of the fifth army, instructed his subordinates, however, that the framediate task was to pursue and destroy as much as possible of the German tenth and fourteenth armies and that entry into
