# Invasion Troops Lunge 10 Miles Inland After Night Landings on Coast Near Cherbourg, Le Havre

SUPREME HEADQUARTERS, ALLIED EXPEDITIONARY FORCE, LON DON, June 6 (UP)---American, British and Canadian invasion forces landed in northwestern France today, established beachheads in Normandy, and by evening had "gotten over the first five or six hurdles" in the greatest amphibious assault of all time.

Prime Minister Winston Churchill revealed that allied troops were fighting inside Caen, 9½ miles inside northwest France, that the invasion penetrations had reached several miles in depth in some cases, and that footholds had been established on a broad front as the operation proceeded "in a thoroughly satisfactory in manner."

AN EIGHTII USAAF PHOTO RECONNAISSANCE BASE, June 6 679—Allied landing forces have established beachheads on the coast of northern France and are slashing their way inland, the first photo recommissance pilots back from the scene of the initial thrust said today.
