VAIR'S CONFIDENT AS D-DAY BEGINS

WASHINGTON, June 6 (AP)—An American sergeant, packing concentrated dynamite, peered at the horizon from a trench in the Normandy beachhead and said, "They can't stop us."

Four weeks ago, the sergeant was an "invasion force" member of the war department, being utilized as the greatest military operation of history began "very quietly and without a sound" from the British town whose inhabitants had little idea that anything unusual was going on.





EUROPE INVASION RIGGED BY ALLIES

(From Page One)
Allied overall casualties appeared to have been relatively light. Headquarters announced that they were light among air-borne troops and "superstially small very small" at sea.

The disembarkation went according to plan. Warships succeeded in silencing shore batteries and laying smoke screens on schedule. A United States battleship moved in much closer to shore than any other of the fleet.

The minesweeping was described as the heaviest, and probably the most difficult operation of its kind ever attempted. Hundreds of sweepers headed the invasion force, clearing the water and marking channels. CHICAGO (UPI)—The allies will go into the invasion of Europe with a very big advantage over the Germans in weather prediction, according to Dr. Harold Ward, weather expert and professor of meteorology and geography at Northwestern University.

The allies have access to information which enables them to predict the weather with reasonable certainty on the entire invasion coast, from Spain to Norway, 10 days in advance. The Germans cannot hope to predict accurately more than three days in advance, Dr. Ward said.

The advantage, he explained, is due to the fact that weather, space, temperature and humidity over America, the Atlantic ocean, Greenland and the British Isles, which the Germans have no access, the Germans must rely on their measurements of atmospheric conditions at high altitudes over the coast, obtained from planes which must fly to 17,000 feet, and upon reports of clouds from weather balloons which they make.

VANKS PURSUING NAZIS IN ITALY

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS AT NAPLES, June 6 (UP) — The allied fifth army drove the battered German forces in disorderly retreat across the Tiber river on a front from Rome to the Tyrrhenian sea today and sent powerful armored columns five miles beyond the river under orders to destroy the fleeing enemy.

Front dispatches said that Field Marshal Albert Kesselring's broken fifth army was retreating across the fiercest sort of rear guard resistance as the allied tanks and rifle-armed units across the Tyrrhenian at a score of points north and west of Rome.

At many points the enemy retreat had turned into a disorganized rout under the raking fire of allied planes and tanks, and 2,000 nazis threw down their arms and surrendered to a fast-moving British column that trapped them on the east bank of the river, near the ancient.

Bridges Destroyed

Every bridge across the Tiber below Rome had been blown up by the fleeing Germans, but 11 of the 14 spans inside the capital were intact and allied troops were crossing in a steady stream.

Only in the northwestern outskirts of Rome did the Germans offer any determined resistance. A force of enemy tanks was reported battling desperately around the Littoria airport in an attempt to stem the swift allied advance long enough for the main body of Kesselring's troops to escape.

Official sources said the German had been by-passed in all allied operations in and around the city.

French troops on the fifth army's right flank knifed deep into the hills east of Rome, seizing the highway junction of Tivoli, 16 miles outside the capital.

Retreat Threatened

The French thrust threatened the line of retreat for tens of thousands of German (10th army) troops falling back slowly before the British eighth army in the mountainous country north and east of the Via Cassina.

The eighth and fifth army fronts were linked in a continuous front winding 10 miles inland from the Tyrrhenian coast, through Rome and down into the Tiber valley, and the German pocketed German (10th army) appeared to be fighting only a desperate rear-guard action in an effort to extricate the bulk of its forces.

Allied air forces flew some 2,400 sorties yesterday.
