WIFE AVOIDS ALL DEWEY SPOTLIGHT

ALBANY, N. Y., June 28 (AP)—Mrs. Thomas E. Dewey shuns the spotlight that has blazed for more than 10 years upon her husband. The attractive Texas-born former Frances Fenton Dewey sticks strictly to the role of wife of New York's first Republican governor for 20 years and mother of their children, Thomas E., Jr., 11, and John Martin, 8.

She lets the governor take the boss while she runs the executive mansion here and the Dewey farm house at Pawling, Dutchess county. Yet she takes a deep, personal interest in his political affairs. She does not concern herself with what he says but rather how he says it. She is an audience of one before when Dewey rehearses his major speeches.

R. W. Werry, 60, Passes in Hailey

HAILEY, June 28.—Russell William Werry, 60, known to his friends as "Fuzzy," died at 2:10 p. m. Thursday at the Hailey clinical hospital.

Born at Russell, Colo., March 11, 1884, the son of Nicholas and Hanna Werry, he came to Wood River with his family at the age of 10. His parents settled in Bellevue and were one of that town's pioneer families.

Mr. Werry was married to Dora Goodman on Dec. 29, 1913, in Blackfoot. He is survived by the wife and one son, Lieut. Russell Werry, Jr., who is stationed with the army air corps at Nashville, Tenn. The lieutenant is expected here Wednesday morning.

Four sisters, Mrs. Dora Werry and Mrs. Evelyn Root, both of Boise; Mrs. Beatrice Schauder, Bellevue; and Mrs. Anne Christy, Idaho Falls, and four brothers, Fred and Charles Werry, Hailey; Edward Werry, Boise; and Albert Werry, Rupert, also survive. One brother, Stanley, died in 1927.

Funeral services for Mr. Werry will be held at 2 p. m. Thursday at the Hailey I. O. O. F. hall under the auspices of the Eagle Lodge with Rev. Augustin Jackey assisting. Burial will be in the cemetery under the direction of the Harris funeral home.

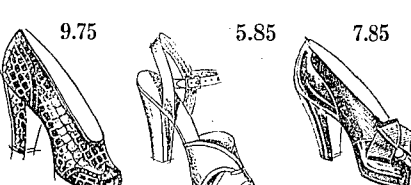
