

Bonin Isles Blasted In Heavy Attack by Naval Task Forces

American forces scourging the Pacific from the Dutch East Indies to the Kuriles in support of the Noemfoor and Saipan invasions struck a new and heavy blow today at the Bonin islands 600 miles from Japan, radio Tokyo announced.

A naval task force sent its aircraft against two Jima and Chenai Jima this morning and heavy fighting "is in progress" after a stab at two Jima yesterday, Tokyo said without confirmation. The enemy also broadcast that large planes raided Yap in the Carolines yesterday, while other American planes hit the northern Kuriles thrice last week-end.

Sorry Remnants of Nazi Army Flee Yanks' Advance in Italy

ROME, July 4 (AP)—The allied armies surged forward across the width of Italy today, with the Americans penetrating to within 15 miles of Livorno (Leghorn) on the west coast and the eighth army advancing to within eight miles of the inland communications center of Arezzo.

The whole area immediately north of the German line was reported to be crawling with enemy vehicles, guns and personnel withdrawing along the highway toward the Adriatic.

Lake Trasimeno was cleared of the enemy as the Germans there fled northward, avoiding combat with the eighth army wherever possible. This flight, however, came only after some Nazi units had been destroyed and slaughtered.

G. O. P. PLATFORM CALLED MYSTERY

WASHINGTON, July 4.—(AP)—Towering Robert B. Kerr, Oklahoma governor, who will keynote the national Democratic convention, has dropped into town and declared that the "great unsolved mystery of this is what the Republican platform means."

He also said Thomas E. Dewey, Republican presidential nominee, had used such phrases as "dislike" and "reference" in his campaign plans. Kerr added that he had received a little reward for what Mr. Dewey means.

"I'm just as ashamed of the Republican platform as Dewey is," Kerr said. "We're in it, in the middle of it, and we know the nature of it and in their minds when they wrote it."

"They've covered practically everything that they've had in the platform as far back as 1920, and they've established a record in record in talking about a durable and lasting peace without giving the people a single specific reference to how they intend to achieve it," he added.

Referring to the refusal of Gov. Earl Warren, California, to allow his name to be placed in more than one place for vice-president, Kerr said: "Being a member of the family, he's supposed to be willing to be put in one place or the other."

Kerr came to the capital from a momentary fishing retreat, where he said he wrote the first draft of his keynote speech in long hand "with a pencil and a bottle of ink."

"The actual draft already has been placed and now there is a jury of the delegates to the convention meeting directly here," he pledged. "Hannegan reported at the party's last convention."

In another prepared speech at the meeting, Senator Bob La Follette, of Wisconsin, urged the Democrats to "bring and receive Franklin D. Roosevelt," and commended him.

Follow the old advice of the party's slogan: "never drop the pilot in the storm."

La Follette said that the "same Republican old guard" was responsible for the Hoover collapse controlled the delegates at the recent Republican convention.
