MADRID, July 8 (AP)—There is a curious, doubt-barricaded story coming out of Nazi-occupied Europe. It says that Hitler is not only a great organizer, but also a great propagandist. He has been able to recruit thousands of German youth to fight in the German army.

One of the story is being told in the German press which for some weeks has been emphasizing the presence of "volunteers" of all nationalities in Europe fighting side by side with Germany.

The other side is told by men of German nationality who have escaped from Nazi territory after months of service in German armed forces—service they describe as anything but voluntary.

These men say that Hitler is not only a great organizer, but also a great propagandist. He has been able to recruit thousands of German youth to fight in the German army.

How the Nazis were persuaded to join the German forces isn't explained, but men who recently escaped from the Pyrenees say they themselves either were conscripted into German service or were "volunteers."

I have talked with several of these escapees, two of whom were wounded in the eastern front. They finally were stationed in France near the border to make an attempt to cross the Pyrenees.

RECORD HARVEST ON MOST FRUITS

WASHINGTON, July 8.—The agriculture department said today that the nation's orchards might overflow with record fruit harvests this year but that civilian supplies of canned fruits probably would be somewhat reduced next year.

Peach production now is expected to be 50 per cent above last year's record crop three times as large and the cherry crop nearly 50 per cent greater. The pear crop probably will be slightly smaller than a year ago.

Record large crops of oranges and grapefruit are expected this year and the department reported that favorable conditions of the 1934 crop now point to another large harvest.

However, with military and lend-lease demands for canned fruit mounting, civilian allocations in 1945 will be less than for this year, the department said.

Citizens supplies of canned peaches for 1945 probably will be one-third below last year. Only about one-third as many canned peaches will be available as in previous years and the dried apricot supply will be smaller than in 1944.

However, more apples and apricots are in view for civilians, the department said.
