- In 1940, our last normal year before the war, the American pcople consumed 55l: billion gallons of petroleum products. This amounted to 427 gallons per person -9 pints a day for every man, woman and child in the United States.

8/10 cent $\times 427=\$ 3$ 42


- So someone has to furnish the petroleum to keep them going. In this country there are 8,267 individual oil companies working full time at this job. During 1940 they made a profit of $8 / 10$ ths of a cent per gallon on the 427 gallons of products you usci- $\$ 3.42$.
