

# Airies Rush Trap To Cut off Flight of Normandy Foe

ON THE FALAISE FRONT, FRANCE, Aug. 16 (AP)—Allied armies sweeping down from the north against the German escape corridor in Normandy today captured Vassy and launched a climactic assault on the Nazi-held Falaise pocket.

Everywhere along the front, the sausage-shaped German salient is collapsing.

British and American troops engaged in a race for Tcherny, on the western end of the salient, but the Americans got there first, whereupon the British turned and captured Montecrest, three miles to the east.

Nazi Save Armor  
However, the headpiece of the Falaise battle to turn the German bulge into "another Stalingrad" was not entirely satisfactory.

A British staff officer at forward headquarters conceded that von Kluge had succeeded in luring the Allies into a battle for the Falaise pocket, but he added that the Germans were now being pushed back to the Falaise river.

Another 20,000 German troops are reportedly cut off on the Falaise front, but the exact number of troops being held at Falaise is being reduced as the Allies advance.
