AMERICANS LOSE ALL BRIDGEHEADS ALONG 55 MILES

Americans Lose All Bridgeheads Along 55 Miles

PARIS, Jan. 3 (AP)—American forces have lost all their bridgeheads in Germany along a 55-mile stretch between the Sarreguemines and the Rhine in a withdrawal to north-eastern France dictated by developments elsewhere, front dispatches revealed tonight.

PARIS, Jan. 3 (AP)—Third army units in the Saarland and Palatinate region northeast of Bastogne today on the Diarzial railroad toward St. Vith and reports of heavy eastward traffic within the wedge, suggesting a possible German breakthrough.

The Germans lashed out at other third and seventh army units along a 70-mile sector from Saarbrücken to the Rhine and at one place southeast of Bielefeld struck up to two miles into the German rear.

Behind the Bleifried line in the Saarland and Palatinate, a considerable increase was noted in enemy activity and supreme headquarters in its communique said.

More Towns Taken
Three more towns were recaptured in the Saarland region today. These were Margart, Gertrich and Mandel-St. Etienne.

BOMBERS OPEN 1945 OFFENSIVE AGAINST JAPAN

WASHINGTON, Jan. 3 (AP)—B-29 Superfortresses crashed hundreds of tons of bombs on the Japanese war production centers of Nagoya, Osaka and Hamamatsu today in the opening blow of the 1945 offensive against the enemy homeland.

A Japanese communique admitted fire damage to vital facilities and factories in the Nagoya and Osaka areas.

A brief U. S. war department announcement said only that Saipan-based B-29s attacked industrial targets on the capital island of Honshu, but the enemy communique identified the three war centers as the targets of "about 90" Superfortresses.

The main force concentrated on the big aircraft center of Nagoya, the Japanese communique said while other units rained the Osaka area, 55 miles to the southeast, and the Hamamatsu area, 50 miles to the southeast.

The communique claimed that 17 B-29s had been shot down and 25 damaged by Japanese fighters. Two Japanese planes were not yet reported back, it added.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 3 (AP)—Absenteeism from plants near race tracks is so bad that the federal government has ordered the tracks closed after a government official, who declines to be quoted by name, but who described as "relatively insignificant" the number of workers directly involved in the operation of race tracks.

"Absenteeism is the answer," he said. "There has been a regular pattern of increased absenteeism following the opening of the tracks. In some instances the increase has been as much as 30 per cent."

REICH RECEIVES 12-DAY BOMBING

LONDON, Jan. 3 (AP)—American planes bombed Germany for the first time today in the 12-day bombing of the Reich.

The brand of the British night blow fell on Ludwigsburg and Nuremberg in southwestern Germany, while a diversionary force of 100 bombers dropped scores of two-ton bomb-busters on Berlin.
