A LONG WAR How long is the war going to last? For the country and most of 18 fighting men, perhaps another year or two. For the many who won't come back, another day or week or month. But for thousands upon thousands of others it will last for 20 or 30 or 40 years, through the daily reminders of infirmities, shocks, fears and shattered nerves.

The causes of these thousands' mistortune

The causes of these thousands misfortunes will be forgoticn by others as the years pass and today's sharp events blur and fade. Only he evidence of the misfortunes will remain. Ind the thousands will become pitiable or centric oid men to their families, their riends, and the casuaj passers-by. It is always so with way. 


