



The inducted 4-F would rather be under military discipline and, whatever his work, would draw military pay. He would not be guaranteed his old job after the war, as other soldiers are. He would get no war insurance, mustering-out pay or deferment of debts. He would not be eligible for benefits from the veterans administration for himself or his dependents.

whole country.


