Another Landing On Luzon Makes Pincers Assault

MACARTHUR HEADQUARTERS, LUZON, Feb. 2 (AP)—Manila was in a American trap today. Its 8th army invasion troops fashioned a pincers on the Philippines capital by landing on the Batangas province coast 67 road miles southwest of the city while sixth army spearheads drove to within a bare 20 miles on the north. The 11th airborne division swept ashore from landing craft virtually unopposed along five miles of Batangas beach near Nanay and quickly pressed eastward toward 2,000-foot Tanyag ridge, which commands fine highways leading to Manila and the Cavite naval base in Manila bay, 32 miles away.

Gen. Douglas MacArthur reported today that this third Luzon invasion—the second by the newly formed eighth army in 48 hours—again caught the Japanese by surprise.

"We landed without loss," he announced, explaining that the landing "largely seals off the possibility of enemy troops escaping to the north and joining those in the north, and definitely outflanks the enemy's defensive line in southern Luzon."

The first wave of Maj. Gen. J. M. Bwings 11th airborne troops all the shore without firing a shot. Within 10 minutes the town of Nanay was in American hands, and within 15 minutes the Japanese had fled. The town was quickly followed by the 31st Airborne Division, which captured the town of Balabac, Gen. Robert Eichelberger's 6th Airborne Division. The assault on Balabac was a reconnaissance move, planning to pull out the opposition to the north. Three hours later, he changed it to a full-scale invasion.

The invasion, flanking the jaws of a trap north and south of Manila, caught the fast-moving American 11th air army spearheads in a pincers assault. Checked in the city, they were ordered to retreat to the north. Patrols are operating freely in and around the city.

Americans Drive Deep in Weakened Siegfried Line

PARIS, Feb. 2 (AP)—Numerous undefended pillboxes fell today to American divisions driving deeper into the central Siegfried line, so thinned by demands of the Russian front that the expedition drove that the Germans might be falling back to the Rhine.

American and French attacks in Alsace virtually crashed the thrust to Strasbourg and swiftly shrank the Colmar pocket. For all practical purposes, the German stragglers had been driven back to the cross-hatched pocket to about 35 miles south of the Alsatian capital.

The drive was reached at many points northeast of besieged Colmar. The Breisach border bridge was under shelling from allied guns three miles away.

Continued thaws allowed some of the American first and third army divisions along a 40-mile section of the Siegfried line opposite the eastward and allied air power late yesterday battered at Elbing bridges and railroads to disrupt the flow toward the eastern front.

The Americans widened their stand at Elbing by capturing Landeshut, six miles east of St. Vith and a little more than seven miles from the heavily fortified rail center of Prun.

Yankees, British Closing in Fast On Nazi Capital

LONDON, Feb. 2 (UP)—The Germans reported today that powerful Russian forces massing along the Oder east of Berlin were trying to smash across that last big barrier before the capital, in the process of which the terrified civilians are throwing up barricades.

The German command said strong red army units had reached the Oder on either side of Frankfurt, 38 miles east of Berlin, and northwest of Kustrin, where the Oder flows into the Baltic sea.

A Nazi military commentator reported that the first effort by Marshal Georgy K. Zhukov's first white Russian army to force the Oder was made at Kustrin, 42 miles east-northeast of Berlin.

The courageous citizens of Kustrin chased back a Soviet tank detachment which was trying to cross the Oder, destroying six of the tanks and damaging others. The commander, Wilfried von Offen, said in a German home service pep talk.

3,000 QUIT JOBS IN MOVIE STRIKE

HOLLYWOOD, Feb. 2 (AP)—The multi-million dollar film industry started a serious labor dispute in 1936 when 3,000 motion picture extra workers went out on strike because of a jurisdictional dispute between the independent screen players union and the Screen Actors Guild (SAG) affiliate.

Michael Jeffers, SAG business agent, announced today that the SAG officials said they would consider the action a strike against the guild and said all SAG members, including top-flight actors—would be told to ignore SAG picket lines ordered around the studios.

Principal people of contention concern jurisdiction over bordering workers such as bit players, stunt men and extras. Previously, the SAG had claimed jurisdiction over all actors and extras.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 2 (AP)—The office of price administration acted today to put a larger proportion of top-grade steaks and roasts on the market. The OPA said it had secured large allocations to be made to the armed services.

The OPA ordered limitations on the amount of the two top grades of beef that any individual wholesaler, druggist, dealer or retailer may handle the next two months.

"Much of this top-grade beef has been going consistently into the hands of bootleggers," the OPA said. "Some retail slaughterhouses also have concentrated on the two top grades."

JAPAN'S TOTALITARIAN PARTY

American monitors picked up an interesting wireless dispatch the other day from the Dornel news agency to its clients in the hinterlands. It revealed that a totalitarian political party was in the process of formation in Japan.

Probably the dispatch was a little puzzling to most Americans who read it. Isn't Japan totalitarian already? Isn't the Jap method of government the German-Comitee government control, complete obedience, complete regimentation of thought, speech and action?

The answer seems to be: Fundamentally, yes; superficially, no. The chief difference seems to be that a fiction of free speech and representative government still exists in Japan. There was a general election in 1942. Several independent members were elected to the diet, although the Imperial Rule Assistance Political society tried to nominate all the candidates.

On the same day the new totalitarian party was announced, Premier Koiso had appeared in the lower house of the diet and heard some sharp criticism of inadequate plans for munition production from the opposition. The session ran like one of Mr. Churchill's heated set-to's in commons, or an unwhipped debate in our own congress.

That Japanese version of free speech in wartime doesn't mean much. The diet can blow off steam, but it can't do much about government policy or conduct of the war. It can't remove the cabinet. About the strongest independent member is a member of the opposition, but he is not allowed to approve the budget—if it dares.

The Japanese government is largely run from behind the scenes by military men and their lackeys. The German-Comitee representatives of the IRAPS and its parent organization, the Imperial Rule Assistance Association, may sit in on the councils, but they are not allowed to make any decisions.

Japanese political parties can't be compared with our Democrats and Republicans, nor with the Nazi or fascist type of party. In Germany, of course, the Nazi party is the dominant party. In Japan, the Imperial Rule Assistance Association may have even a shadow of the Nazi organization's power.

What then will the new Jap party accomplish? It will help to bolster the Jap position, which suffered a blow when we landed on Balpan. It may be designed to unify public opinion and to suppress criticism of the Jap military and industrial program. 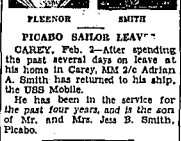

CHICAGO—THE YOUNG GIANT

For about four decades of the last century—from 1840 until well into the 1890's—Chicago grew more rapidly in population in commercial importance than any other community in the world. It was like a heavy lad who undergoes a growth spurt before he has had time to get used to his own size. The rate of this button-bursting expansion is that the site of Chicago was about twice the place along the shore of Lake Michigan where one might reasonably expect the birth of a metropolis. The town stood at the mouth of the Chicago river in the wealthy district—still topped along the nation. The land was low, wet and malarial. The ground on which the city's original business stands—now "now" as the loop—was a marsh only a few inches higher than the level of the sea.

In 1837 the Illinois legislature had incorporated the community a city under the name of Chicago. Its name in popular speech was Slab Town, and it was known as such because every house in the community was a board-and-batten structure of boards or planks. Besides other things, the town place had still another name, evolved from the experience of travelers who were often tried to dash across a street in rainy weather. By then it was called the city of the flat roof.

The new little city had a population of about 4,000, made up chiefly of fur traders, grain buyers, wagoners, blacksmiths, gamblers and shopkeepers. The town was full of adventurers, ready for anything except hard work. In manner or equipment the residents were like those of the other new towns of the midwest. They drank their "squibs" of raw whisky, gambled excessively, danced all night, whooped and whooped, and the streets were frequently, with or without adequate incentive. Murders occurred too often to attract much attention.

But neither mud nor murders held Chicago down. In 1837, 23 years after its incorporation, it had 25,000 inhabitants and newcomers were still arriving in an unbroken stream. Among them were John Richard Kober, Wendell, and Gene Moore and Albert Abraham Timm, both of Jerome.

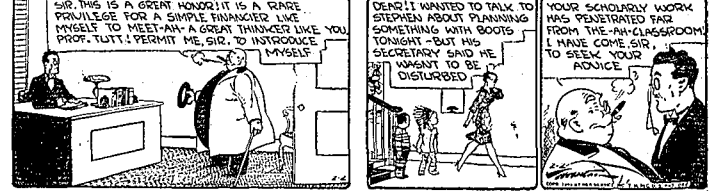

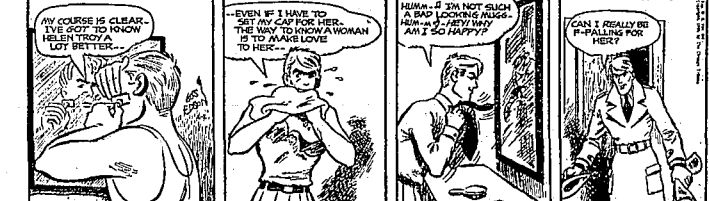
