NO HOLDS BARRED

In Fight to the Death; Rules of War Scrapped

LONDON, Feb. 14 (UP)—European dispatches said today that Germany has proclaimed her intention of scrapping the rules of war for a "no-holds-barred" fight to the death, as a result of the big three's Crimean declaration. The new policy is said to have been set forth yesterday by Paul Schmidt, official spokesman for the German foreign office, in an angry outburst at the Wilhelmstrasse over the joint statement of President Roosevelt, Prime Minister Churchill and Premier Stalin. Stockholm sources speculated that Schmidt's statement might foreshadow German use of poison gas. The death sentence outlined for Germany in the Crimean declaration frees the reich of "all moral obligations" to abide by the rules of war, the nazi-controlled Scandinavian telegraph bureau quoted Schmidt as saying at a press conference. "The Germans henceforth will conduct the war with all suitable means, no matter how grim their effect," Schmidt said. The STB dispatch, published in Stockholm newspapers, said mention of the Crimean declaration caused "by far the worst explosion" foreign correspondents ever have witnessed at a Wilhelmstrasse press conference.

POWERTRICKERY TO BE ERASED IN SECURITY PLANS

WASHINGTON, Feb. 14 (UP)—The big three declaration for joint action in Europe was aimed at any power-hungry men who might hope to gain their ends in liberated countries by trickery or force. It also according to War Mobilization Director James F. Byrnes, was the nation's notice to the world that it is against "spheres of influence" and will assume "its share of responsibility" for helping the peoples freed from nazism. Byrnes disclosed that President Roosevelt proposed and wrote the declaration, which pledges Russia, Britain and the United States to help liberated nations "to solve by democratic means their political and economic problems." At a news conference a few hours after his return from the Crimea, Byrnes said the declaration, which reaffirms the Atlantic charter, "will eliminate any hope of political factions in such countries that try to place one great power against another."

ONE PURPOSE—OR MORE? A reader of the Times-News, who fears that "many political leaders have a more far-reaching object in mind, than the nation's request that congress enact legislation providing for postwar universal service, has called our attention to the comments of H. A. Olney in a recent issue of the National Republic.

Olney wants to know why the government is so set on doing away with the national guard which he regards as the military core of our defense set-up. State militias are the backbone of the American system of government, he argues, because "they are symbolic of our very structure of government, which recognizes state rights and local responsibility."

He suggests one reason for the opposition. Radical labor leaders have had an axe out for the national guard which protects the nation within in peacetime as well as without in wartime. The national guard was called out during the nationwide air attack strikes.

While Olney has no particular quarrel with universal service, he does raise a question that has many Americans thinking. "The program which congress enacts for our postwar military security," he warns, "should not be based on the basis of social experiments or schemes to regiment our youth under the guise of military training.
