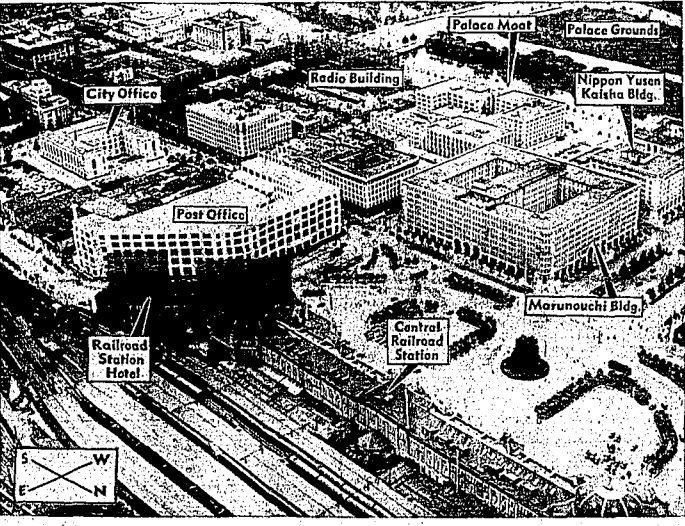
Americans Inaugurate All-out Assault With Blow That Continues Nine Hours; Jap Navy Dared to Come out and Fight

GUAM, Feb. 16 (AP)—Tokyo was raided by more than 1,500 American carrier planes today in an unprecedented attack which Japanese headquarters said lasted for more than nine hours while the greatest naval fleet ever assembled hunted for a fight within 300 miles of Japan's shores. Protecting Vice Adm. Marc A. Mitscher's carrier forces, battleships, cruisers and destroyers of Adm. Raymond A. Spruance's fifth fleet spread out in a 200-mile column in Japanese waters, daring the enemy fleet to come out.
