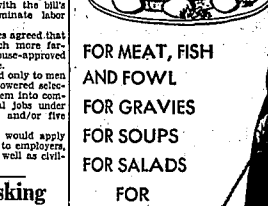



"—Yes, very sorry to hear it. Why? Because, Monsieur, there is too much of it already—entirely too much."

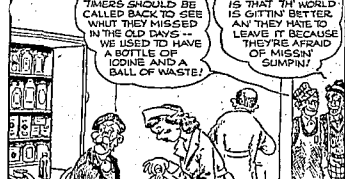

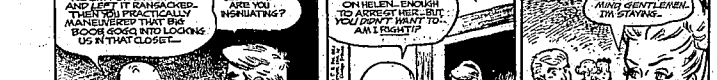

At one time, according to Nelson, their ship, a destroyer escort made a degree roll which he described as rough to make one remember all the bad things he had ever done.

"Old salts can talk about rough seas," continued the sailor, "but they don't get any rougher than that one."

A. QUICK METHOD: The simplified withholding receipt your employer gives you. Usually you may use this if your pay was less than \$5,000.

B. SHORT CUT: The short form 1040. (If you earned less than \$5,000, no matter how you earned it.)

C. LONG WAY ROUND: The long form 1040 must be used if your income was above \$5,000, or if your deductions come to more than ten per cent of total income. But anyone MAY use it.
