Idaho Racing Bill, up for Vote Today, Declared Constitutional

BOISE, March 1 (AP)—The bill to legalize pari-mutual betting at horse races and set up a state racing commission comes up for final action in the house today and Attorney General Frank Langley said yesterday the bill is constitutional.

The measure which members have given little chance to reach the floor of the lower chamber was introduced several weeks ago by the forestry and public lands committee, headed by Rep. Robert H. Mills, R. Boise. It was referred to the ways and means committee which now has reported it out with a favorable recommendation. Ways and means is headed by Majority Leader Ed Gaffney, R., Clearwater.

Langley's opinion on the bill's constitutionality was asked by Assistant Majority Leader Lloyd P. Barren, R., Coeur d'Alene, a member of ways and means.

The attorney general said the measure conflicts neither with the constitutional ban on lotteries nor the prohibition against special or class legislation.

"I'm expressing no opinion concerning House bill 139 other than that it does not violate any provision of the constitution of the state of Idaho," Langley wrote. "In my opinion the bill is constitutional."

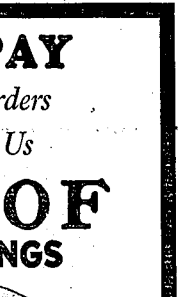

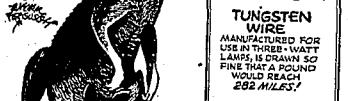

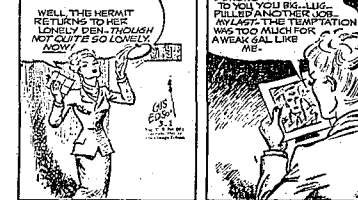

YANKS REPORTED ON ANOTHER ISLE

WASHINGTON, March 1 (AP)—Approximately 2,000 American troops were reported by Tokyo today to have landed on 270-mile-long Palawan island, westward of the Philippines.

Palawan is the 17th island in the Philippines invaded by American amphibious forces. A Tokyo broadcast said the Americans landed a "residual" of troops on Palawan, connecting link between Mindoro in the Philippines and Borneo in the Dutch East Indies.

The broadcast admitted the Japanese had only a small garrison on the 4,027-square-mile island, but claimed it was offering "valiant resistance."

Gen. Douglas MacArthur reported that strong formations of American attack bombers hammered Jap installations at Puerto Princesa. That island, 750 miles east of Saigon, in French Indo-China, stretches from southeast to the east and is flanked on the west by the South China sea and on the east by the Sulu sea.

German Resistance In Italy Continues

ROME, March 1 (AP)—German resistance, stilling across the Senio river south of the Russi-Lugo line, inflicted 17 miles of German Adriatic coast, have driven eight army troops from some of their positions. Allied forces were attacked and took a number of prisoners.

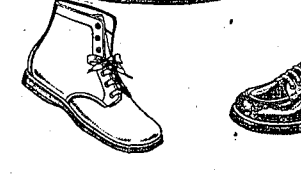

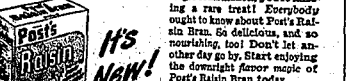
