FLIER FREED IN FRENZY SLAYING

KUNNING, March 2 (Delayed)—A 31-year-old air force officer whose two shots from his service pistol ended the agonized screaming of a 20-year-old sergeant, gunner, hopelessly trapped in a flaming plane, was acquitted today of a charge of voluntary manslaughter.

Seven colonels deliberated 30 minutes before clearing the lieutenant colonel, commander of a fighter group, veteran of 80 missions and ranking officer at the forward base. The defendant did not testify.

Whether his name was the victim's was given in this dispatch. Presumably censorship withheld them.

It was reported that the decision hinged on reasonable doubt as to whether death was caused by the shots or burning, and on the degree of provocation.

10 Witnesses Tell Story
The witnesses told this story of the shooting last Jan. 15:
It was gray January afternoon when the B24s with a crew of five returned from a mission, overhead its landing and hurtled down a 60-foot embankment.

As rescuers surrounded the plane, flames leaped high, the top turret guns and oxygen tanks exploded from the heat.

Braving the flames, fellow fliers pulled out the dead co-pilot and rescued the seriously injured pilot. They found the sergeant, gunner, bear-trapped in the flight compartment, his legs caught by buckled straps.

Six men tried to pull the still-conscious gunner free. There was no time to cut away the metal and physicians could not get into position to amputate his legs.

Screams Rise Above Flames
His screams rose above the roar of the flames. An engineering officer at the base, drawing his revolver, exclaimed: "I am going to shoot him. I can't stand hearing him scream."

He fired one shot into the ground to see if the pistol functioned, took aim, wavered and turned away saying: "I can't do it."

"Don't shoot me! Pull me out of here!" screamed the gunner.

The trapped man quailed. He gazed at the colonel. Then his mud-stained head slumped and his eyes turned away. Two shots were almost indistinguishable above the exploding 20 caliber bullets.

Rather than base his case on a contention that the shooting was an act of mercy, defense counsel emphasized that the defendant had acted irrationally under great emotional strain.

The main pillar of the defense was argument that condition of the victim's body, later recovered, afforded precise medical testimony raising reasonable doubt that the sergeant had died of bullets rather than burning.

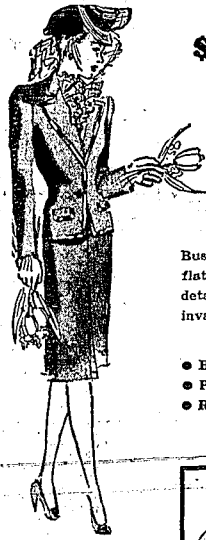

PORK SAUSAGE IN STATE DEFINED

BOISE, March 8 (AP)—Idaho's pork sausage goes back to just that after two years of undefined freedom. The senate passed and sent to the governor by a 26-3 vote a bill defining hamburger, pork sausage and other sausage. Only swine products may be used in the product.

Senate President Pro-Tempore J. E.ner Willard, R., Bingham, expressed approval. "It is inevitable in favor of this bill because it keeps good lamb out of pork sausage," he told the senate. Meanwhile, the senate saw up in its search for senate bill No. 137.

The bill's sponsor, the judiciary and corporations committee, gave up today and introduced the measure all over again as senate bill No. 163.

It would allow county commissioners to give to the state any land on which the state owns buildings.

JAPS BURN 2,500 FILIPINOS ALIVE

New York, March 8 (AP)—The New York Herald Tribune says last night in a copyrighted story from Manila that documentary evidence has disclosed that 2,500 civilians were burned or burned alive in the old walled city of Iloilo during the Japanese occupation between Feb. 7 and 13.

Most of the butchers occurred in the northwest corner of Iloilo, where prisoners were arbitrarily classed as guerrillas and executed, the newspaper says.

The documents, bearing the testimony of eyewitnesses, confirm independent estimates by officers of the 14th corps, revealing the worst massacre of the Pacific war, the Herald Tribune states that witnesses kept a record of the Port Sanitico killings.

More than 3,000 persons were executed alive by our troops. Approximately 1,000 are unaccounted for of the Iloilo population of 7,000 civilians.

Reports also reached army officials today, the story says, of mass slaughter of defenseless civilians in various areas of Iloilo province, now being cleared by the 14th air-borne division.

About 12,500,000 yards of outing flannel, print cloth, broadcloth, poplins, lawns and chambrays will be channelled into 14 types of children's garments.

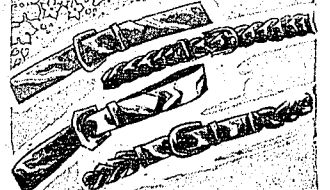
