U.S. Tank Forces Half Way Across Domain of Hitler

PARIS, March 27 (AP)—Lieut. Gen. George S. Patton's leading tank column are reported halfway across Germany today and closing fast on the Hessian city of Fulda, 128 miles southwest of Berlin and 90 miles beyond the Rhine.

Racing through demoralized German resistance, Patton's American third army troops are riding roughshod through the heart of southwestern Germany.

The Yanks are running far ahead of their aerial interference, and German military spokesmen place them within a few miles of Fulda after a 42-mile advance northeast from Frankfurt.

The radio report said allied forces had nighted Patton's tanks speeding down the main highway toward Nuremberg, which lies only 80 miles east of the old Czechoslovak border and 150 miles northwest of Adolf Hitler's mountain hideaway at Berchtesgaden.

At Fulda, Patton's third army would be only 240 miles from the northern flank was pressing east almost as fast as the third army against equally chaotic enemy opposition.

Radio Tokyo Declares Yankees Are on Cebu

MANILA, March 27 (AP)—Tokyo radio said today that American troops had landed on Cebu, one of the last three major islands in the Philippines still controlled by Japanese.

He was accompanied by his wife, the former Mary Bain, Berkeley, Calif. He came to Twin Falls with Mrs. Hameltrath after meeting her in Berkeley. He entered the navy in 1941. He was in the Pacific from June 24, 1940, and had much of his training at Norfolk, Va.

"I guess Lady Luck must have taken a fancy to me, for not once in the 27 months I have spent in the Pacific has anything happened to me," the young service man said while relaxing on his leave.

"I have been recommended for shore duty, but to tell the honest truth, I would just as soon go out again. For the last year, I have been on a ship that has been an advanced base for patrol planes. We had the good fortune to visit almost all of the islands in the south Pacific. Among them were New Guinea, Admiralty, Schouten, Morotai, Halmahera, Paduan and the Philippines.

Exciting After All

"In the Halmahera islands, I had a very exciting time. For it was there the Japs spent an unsuccessful week trying to sink my ship. They would come in every evening at sundown and give us hell, but to tell the truth, just a little more in store for them than they had for us."

"Between the army and my ship, we shot down a good number of their planes. It's hard to tell who shot down a plane when everyone is firing at the same time, so I would not say who has the most, but my ship, or the army. It really doesn't matter as long as they are shot down."

Week of Hell

"During the time the Japs were doing all of this riding on my ship, Tokyo Rose was broadcasting the daily reports of the raids, and I had one the feeling that an unseen eye was watching him all the time. For there was not one move in that whole week of hell that they did not know just what we were doing."

"It was fun, though, to listen to the things she had to say about the raids, for they were always fetched. They would set a certain day to sink us and then report the next day that we were sunk, only to follow up with another report that we were still afloat and they would get us that night."

Glad of Escape

"I guess in the end they figured that the price they were paying for nothing was too great, so they gave up, and we were never bothered again as long as we were in the area. I was glad when the Japs gave up the idea of trying to sink us, for I am not one who craves so much undivided attention."

"Of all the places that I have been, I have never been given such a warm welcome as the one which the Filipino natives gave us. One could never imagine the joy of a hunted people until he saw it with his own eyes."

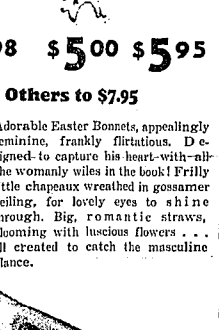

Edward Babcock, candidate for mayor on the Official Progressive party ticket, charged Tuesday that administration officials had found no way to remove the city of highway district "alibi for the city's failure to cope with the noxious weed situation inside the corporate limits."

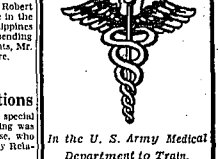

OPA EQUALIZATION ORDER EXPLAINED

Explanation of the new equalization of manufacturers' and retailers costs was given here last night by E. P. Ney, price specialist of the Boise office of OPA, to nearly 30 local retail merchants in the Idaho Power company auditorium.

Ney spent the greater part of the meeting explaining methods to be used in preparing the "pre-price chart" to be used by dealers selling clothing, house furnishings, shoes and bedding.

He said that "in the past if an item which sold for \$5 could be purchased for \$3, the control was inconsistent if the manufacturer's cost dropped to a point where he could sell the same item for \$2."

"In other words," Ney said, "the dealers' profit, uncontrolled, rose sharply without OPA control, the result being an inflation in certain lines."

"The new plan not only places the old rising prices in some lines, but suspends the lid on a sliding adjustment which allows it to be raised or lowered in proportion to the cost of the manufacturer."

Speaking of clothing, Ney stated that "of all commodities, clothing has gone up far more than all other commodities."

"There will be no immediate effect in lowering prices of clothing," he said, "but we do feel certain that a noticeable reduction, possibly between six and eight per cent, will be apparent by September."

OPA clothing prices will be going up about 11 per cent.
