Germans Kill Own Civilians in Mine

WEHOFEN, NEAR DUISBURG, Germany, March 28 (AP)—German machine gunners raked the crowded entrances of an abandoned coal mine to prevent the surrender of 7,000 of their own civilians who had huddled inside without food and water for four days and nights.

These civilians, mostly old men, women and children who had been trapped in a no-man's land, still were living in the mine today. At least 10 of their number had been killed. Some were dying. Some were pregnant women already in labor. All were weak from hunger.

The Germans committed the atrocity last Saturday when an American infantry company of 79th division swung in for the kill on the heavily defended mining area.

7 Armies Turn on Full Power Along 300-mile Nazi Batteline

Patton Beyond Frankfurt



Lieutenant-General Patton's third American army passes the stalled forces of the west with a snap ahead the Rhine that closed on the great industrial city of Frankfurt.

The fact is, they've been expecting them for a long time, declared the diplomat, Victor Gutulesco, former member of the Romanian embassy staff in Tokyo.

He said the Japanese did not appear particularly pleased about the prospect of giving shelter to Nazi or fascist leaders, fearing it may make life harder for them than it already is.

He added emphatically, however, that anyone who thinks the Japanese are going to quit is gravely mistaken. Gutulesco attributed the spirit of defeatism to recent American air raids, which wiped out little by little the standard of living there to a level below that of a bare existence level.

Contrary to Japanese expectations American air raids have done little to disrupt transport in Japan, he asserted. He said the Japanese believe they are not going to be hard to repair, due to manpower shortage.

PARIS, March 28 (AP)—The seven allied armies of the west struck with their full armor power along the German 300-mile batteline east of the Rhine today in a series of breakthroughs that sent American tank columns to within 200 miles of Berlin.

Hundreds of American and British tanks swept ahead of the advancing infantry divisions and raced almost unopposed across the flaming relich anywhere from 20 to 90 miles beyond the Rhine. The entire German front appeared to have disintegrated.

The American first army swept 60 miles or more beyond the middle Rhine to the outskirts of Glessen, 230 miles southwest of Berlin, splitting through the center of the westmecht front and outflanking Frankfurt-on-Main.

LONDON, March 28 (AP)—Four Russian armies hammered in a four-pronged attack on the German front in the Balkans today, sending the Russian supply system working almost to prepare a full-scale offensive on this front closest to the Nazi capital.

The third Ukrainian army has slammed through passing Nazi armor in a sweep that collapsed the Nazi line in 20 miles of Austria and 88 of Vienna and the German high command is trying to prevent the central Panzer army, south of their closest armor units.
