





No one has time to pump water by hand these days, so make sure that your water system is properly cared for. A check-up now and then is better than a breakdown, Just follow these simple rules:

First: Check the electric motor often. Be certain that it is well lubricated and clean. Be sure that it has overload

Second: Keep the oil in the crankcase up to the oil level mark. There is an oil level mark on all pumps.

Third: Keep the stuffing box tight, but not too tight. A good system is to tighter the stuffing box until the water stops leaking then unscrew it for one-half turn, until it leaks only about one or two drops each minute.

Fourth: Keep belt tension right. Too tight a belt throws extra load on the motor. Too loose belts cause slippage, excess belt wear and loss of power.

EQUIPMENT CARE IS IMPORTANT

Your electric farm equipment needs but little care, but that little care is important. If a major breakdown occurs, do not attempt to repair it yourself - call an experienced repair man.



WHO WILL GET POST-WAR BEET QUOTAS?

Maps are being re-drawn in 1945. International boundary lines are being relocated. War is also re-alligning industries . . . steel, aircraft, munitions. Even agriculture will feel the permanent effects of the war.

For example, sugar beets. Before our very eyes beet production areas are shifting. Every veteran beet grower knows that he can't grow an unlimited sugar beet acreage in normal times. Government quotas divide the American sugar market among all producing areas. Normally, beet growers supply only 23 per cent of our needs. Last year, we furnished only 15 per cent. Some beet districts have done better than others; for example, the Nyssa-Nampa district, with its pace-setting acreage increase for the na-tion; Yakima Valley, in Washington, and portions of Montana and Minnesota. Mean-time, Southern Idaho districts have scarcely produced half a pre-war crop.

After the war these trends will likely have an important bearing on future acreage allotments.

What will happen to postwar beet acceage guotas for this district? That's a guestion

every beet grower, every stockman, every citizen who values the beet sugar industry and wants to preserve it for its multiple benefits should ponder now. Take land values alone. Sugar beets are a prime factor in stabilizing the prices of farm lands. Any serious curtailment of the industry would be fol-lowed by a corresponding deflation of farm land values. Other losses are more obvious.

Our valley needs the sugar beet industry. Our famers need the cash crop and the sound rotation program which can be built around it. Our livestock men need the by-products. The nation needs the sugar-so plant more beets in 1945.

"Production history has been an important factor in pro-rating the domestic production quotas among growers under the Sugar Act of 1937. When that part of the legis-lation becomes fully effective again, production history will likely be as important as before the war.
