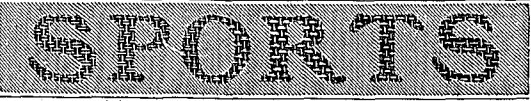

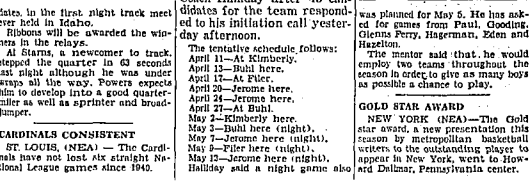

MOUNTAIN HOME, April 3 (AP)—Unexploded bombs and loose ammunition which may have been dropped on Idaho range and farmlands from fourth air force planes make it highly probable that...

Col. John H. Gibson, commander of the Mountain Home army airfield, opened a campaign today to warn civilians and military personnel of the hazards an unexploded ammunition accidentally dropped from planes.

"Occasionally it becomes necessary for combat crews to jettison their bombs outside our prescribed bombing ranges because of malfunctioning of equipment," the colonel explained.

"When this happens the bombs are dropped as 'duds' that either fall to the ground without detonating or exploding. These unexploded bombs contain about three pounds of black powder which is a highly sensitive explosive and, if tampered with, this powder may explode causing serious injuries or burns."

The colonel added that in rare instances cartridges or bells of ammunition have fallen from planes.
