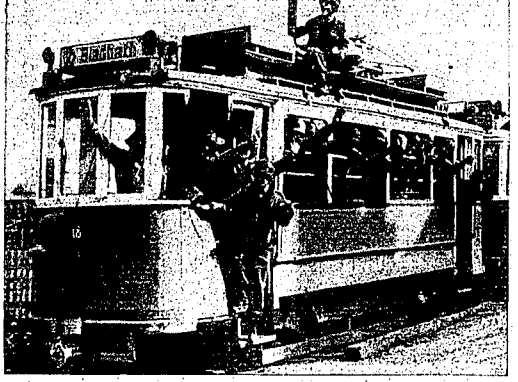

By Tom Connelly. The rising tide of resentment against acquiescence in the treatment of the nations involves many powerful voting groups in the United States.

AGAIN IT'S A BAD SIGN. One of the discouraging things about the recent city election was that only about half the voters were interested enough to go to the polls.

With two complete tickets in the race and three candidates for mayor, there was plenty of opposition to arouse interest even under normal conditions, but in spite of the unusual importance of city government during the last two years only 2,538 voters cast their ballots.

Although there are more than 7,000 voters registered in Twin Falls, it is reasonable to assume that many of those eligible to vote are sitting or serving in the armed forces or working in war plants.

But even the most conservative estimates show that at least 5,000 Twin Falls citizens were qualified to go to the polls.

In the 1934 election only 4,447 voters were cast. At that time the population of the city was around 13,000. Since then there has been considerable growth, and with the addition of the new industries, it is estimated that the city's population is now figured at 16,000.

There is something paradoxical nowadays in the propaganda that is being put out on the streets for a moment—it's a badge. On the street corners, in the homes, and every place that people gather, city, state and national government is argued, pro and con with plenty of heated controversy, lots of condemnation, and little praise.

Yet when it comes time for an election, only half of these people will spend 10 or 15 minutes to vote. They are neither interested in voting a protest against those things they criticized, nor in registering their approval of those things they thought were a good idea.

We say all this is a bad sign because nothing could better demonstrate that our system of democracy is not working. We are falling down miserably in our upkeep of government and we are not doing it for the people and for the people. We want and rage against dictatorial tendencies in government, bureaucracy and the like, and yet we invite that very evolution in government by our failure to fulfill our responsibilities as citizens.

As was brought out in the city election campaign, Twin Falls was never confronted with a two-way race. It was a three-way race that which we now face. Our opportunities almost slager the imagination and our responsibilities were never greater, particularly our obligation to the men and women in the armed forces returning to Twin Falls when the war is over.

It's easy to dismiss all these opportunities and responsibilities with such excuses as "I can't vote," "I'm not doing it for the people," "I won't make any difference who is elected," "Anyone can see that such-and-such a ticket is going to be elected, so why vote?"

It's easy to excuse to cover up our delinquency, and nothing more. Elections have been won by one vote, right here in Twin Falls. And in any election, anything can happen.

If you happen to be among those 2,500 people who didn't vote in the city election, think this all over. Ask yourself if you have any right to criticize when you won't even take the trouble to vote. Ask yourself if you are doing your part in helping to build a bigger and better Twin Falls. Get right down to cases and ask yourself if your failure to vote is something of which you should be ashamed.

The coming run-off election will be a good opportunity for all those who failed to vote to re-examine themselves. Opposition or no opposition, technicalities or no technicalities, it affords us an opportunity to demonstrate that the right of franchise in a free democracy is something we should cherish, and one of the things our men are fighting for.

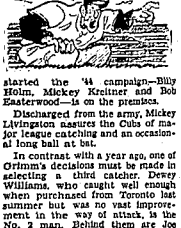

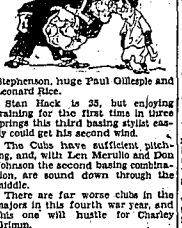

'SHOCKING' VETS' CARE DENOUNCED

"Deplorable" conditions of tubercular and mental cases of Twin Falls county were denounced by Mrs. H. B. Long at the meeting of the Young People's League at the home of Mrs. William Scott, Oregon Color, president, was in charge of the business meeting.

Mrs. Long pointed out: "At this time our veterans' hospitals are in up-to-top shape, but they are inconspicuously run and in a shocking state."

From Misses

The speaker dealt principally with tubercular and mental sanitariums in Idaho. Referring to information gathered from "Third Rate Medicine," written by Albert Mills, published in March and April issues of Cosmopolitan.

There were 1,222 tubercular veterans who died in hospitals in the past 20 years. The rate of death because of TB is 20 per cent higher than in civilian hospitals, she continued.

"The mental hospitals for veterans were found to be run by incompetent staffs and without sufficient attention. Patients were reported beaten by the personnel. Many treated those who were hospitalized were encouraged to degenerate and finally die."

Mrs. Long explained that incompetent help, poor operation, and had food were distributed by stores, and to be responsible for the state of the hospital.

No excuse

"There is no excuse for the veteran hospitals being in this condition. When adequate appropriations are made by the government for proper treatment, this is shown by the 100 per cent recovery rate of a day per patient, compared with \$2 a day per patient in the civilian hospital," she stated.

Mrs. Long said it was suggested in the past that in order to cure the hospital evils new medical heads be established in Washington, D. C., and all personnel transferred, were thoroughly investigated, and incompetent discharged.

Will Send Letter

Members of the club voted to write letters to senators and congressmen in Washington protesting the condition of the hospitals. Jean Daugherty was appointed to write the letter, which will be held in the next session.

The next session will be held in May at the home of Mrs. Charles Greig. Refreshments served by the hostess assisted by Miss Shirley Smith.
