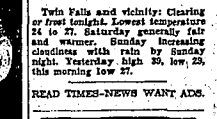

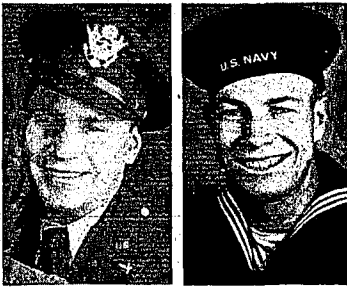

FREEDOM AND BEYOND

Soon after American forces first entered upon German soil, General Eisenhower broadcast an appeal for revolt to the foreign workers inside Germany. The appeal went unanswered and the revolt did not develop. Now the Americans are finding out why.

Thousands of these slave laborers have been freed by the allied advance. And reporters who have come to see the blow have worn of they were uprooted and carried off to supply the conqueror's war machine under threat of the conqueror's guns.

At first they planned to organize organizations, but those who came later nourished the same plans at first. But not even the most ardent spirit could survive many months of the long, hard hours of labor, poor and scanty food, and the squalor and misery of their dwellings.

Later the allied bombers came, the pride to liberation but still a source of terror and danger to friend as well as enemy. The bombings increased to the point of making the gesture and 86 guns. Food grew less and worse, cold and fatigue increased.

As the first prisoners were freed, the Americans brought confusion did these enslaved workers summon the strength to rise up and flee. And when freedom at last had come, they set their weary way out of the hated land of Germany by the shortest route, whether or not they were to their homeland.

There are still millions of them, prisoners, returning to homes scattered all over Europe is a tremendous task that will require months and perhaps years. It will be accomplished by the United States.

SHEEP IN WEREWOLVES' CLOTHING

It was reasonable to suppose that a Nazi underground would develop in the wake of the allied advance, that it would be made up of party fanatics, and that it would have the Hitler-Bismarck blessing. From what can be seen it is not so.

ORIENT—The downfall of the Hitler cabinet, together with the denunciation of the Munich treaty with Tokyo, as predicted in this column April 6, has changed our past command's judgment of the time it will take to bring the Nazi regime to its knees.

ASSISTANCE—Under the terms of the 1941-1945 treaty with Japan, which gave Hitler one of his first years for extra combat in the Pacific, Russia cannot attack Tokyo for another year.

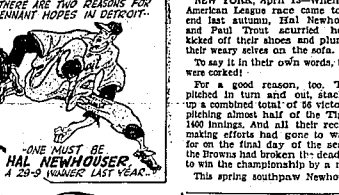

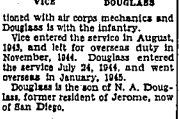
