Nazis Will Leave Yankee Prisoners Behind, Y murrt

WASHINGTON, April 24 (AP)—Capitol Hill heard demands today for a harsh Nazi peace as Germans themselves read a solemn warning that ruthless pursuit and punishment await those who mistreat allied prisoners.

At the same time the United States announced it has accepted a German offer to leave American prisoners of war in camps where they may be liberated by advancing allied armies.

London accepted a similar offer in warning against further atrocities and those already committed was showered upon the rapidly shrinking Reich in the form of leaflets bearing the facsimile signatures of President Truman, Prime Minister Churchill and Marshal Stalin.

Any person, they said, "of whatsoever service or rank in whose charge allied prisoners of war, internees or deported citizens have been received, held, or held individually responsible..."

"Apparently only by being hurt can we drive home to the German people the fullness of war and horror and consequences of the Nazi crimes..."

"We will just have to stand guard over the 70 million people of the world... Only answer... We must continue to force the Germans to accept a policy of the atrocity centers as possible...

Several representatives urged speedy and full punishment of war criminals for the mistreatment of prisoners.

The 35,000 American soldiers still are in Nazi hands, although allied armies already have liberated some 70 camps where 11,500 fighting men were known to be held.

Americans Closing in Final Hurdleway of Enemies in Alps

PARIS, April 24 (AP)—Red armies completed encirclement of embattled Berlin today and a Moscow dispatch said its fall is only hours away.

Half of Berlin has been captured and red banners are flying over the ruins of the Reichstag. Also in Soviet hands is Potsdam, a strategic geographical center of the capital.

The United Press bureau in Moscow cabled flatly that a first Ukrainian army has linked up with the American first army 60 miles south of the city.

American and Russian tanks and motorized columns are working toward the Luxembourg broadcast said. Within the next few days, two more Russian army groups will smash across the Oder in the Silesia area and clear western Pomerania.

German disintegration proceeded slowly. During April alone, more than 1,015,000 prisoners have been captured by General Eisenhower's first western armies which since D-day have taken upwards of 2,245,000.

The seventh army moved to Munich, last reported 60 miles away from the city. The German radio said yesterday Hitler had remained behind at the "main defense line" in Berlin.

LITTLE JEEP RIDE FAR FROM LITTLE

By KENNETH L. DIXON
WITH AEF, Germany, April 24 07—Nobody who was there ever thought the line would come, but every now and then some of the boys trying to get their feet out from under a rather wistful nostalgia of the old days on the Anzio beach-head in Italy.

It was there, you may recall, that correspondents could reach the front from headquarters by a jeep ride of 30 minutes or less in any direction.

I've just returned from the ninth army front in Germany after a two-month absence. It took only one day to come from Washington to Paris, but it took two full days to get from Paris to the front.

It was five days by plane and jeep, hunting suitable airfields, zig-zagging by jeep to outposts across of German pockets, still holding plenty of fight for behind the lines. In addition to several hours' plane riding over Europe it was necessary in following the zigzag course to ride an estimated 400 miles by jeep.

"We don't know how well this is going to work," said Mrs. Charles M. Murray, business manager of the Red Cross office. "If the armistice haven't been signed since we last heard it will be okay."

Unfortunately this jeep press cannot be used again in more than 200 miles. Besides, since no jeeps were available at the old location it is necessary to use some of the jeeps at the plane at that point, 200 miles from the front.

Capt. Donald Davis, Santa Fe, N. M., air liaison officer, apologized for the jeep press. "I'm sorry," he said. "In cheerful ignorance we all started and left this thing all right, but it's not going to get off the ground."

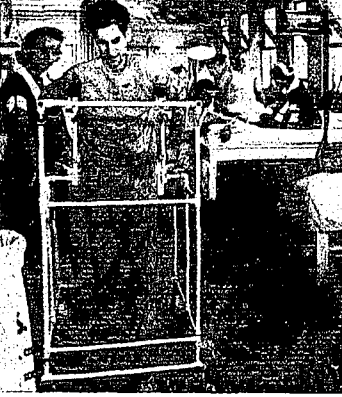
Davis and Murray exchanged a strange look which we understood, and climbed quickly and redoubtably back to the jeep to deliver the other reports.

Shortly thereafter Pvt. Robert C. Page, Waverly, is assigned to drive us forward, appeared, carrying his bedroll.

"Don't you think you'll make it back tonight?" we asked innocently. "Page eyed us playfully a moment and simply said 'no,' and got behind the wheel of the jeep.

What followed for 400 miles and two days something like the one just remembered by my nervous system, plus certain southern segments of the jeep ride, lasted for two months' riding in civilian cars back home.

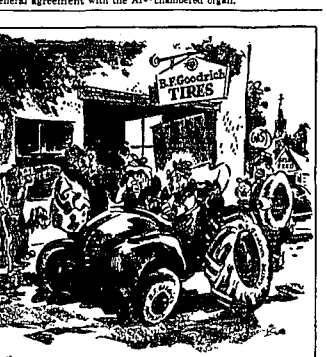
Warren, director of the office of American republic affairs of the state department, brought the report that is expected to form the basis for Argentina's incorporation in the United Nations.

MARSHAL PETAIN TO GIVE SELF UP

BERN, April 24 (AP)—Marshal Petain entered Switzerland from Germany today after asking and receiving permission to cross the neutral country into France to surrender to French authorities.

The French chief of state of the Vichy regime, his wife and several companions crossed the border at St. Margreite, near the eastern end of Lake Constance.

In making the Swiss federal council to permit his transit, Petain declared himself willing to surrender in France and stand trial, it was announced.

However, he will remain in Switzerland temporarily until contact is made with the proper French authorities.

His move to surrender came the same day that his trial, in absentia, was scheduled to begin.

(This dispatch did not indicate how he had managed to make good his flight from Germany. On at least one occasion since he went into the Reich he was reported in custody of the Germans. He had been head of a puppet French regime set up by the Nazis in Sigmaringen, Germany.)

(The Swiss radio said Pierre Laval, former chief of government at Vichy, had attempted to cross the frontier of nearby Liechtenstein

WALLACE IN ROW WITH SENATORS

WASHINGTON, April 24 (AP)—Henry A. Wallace got a stormy reception from Republicans on the House ways and means committee today when he backed tariff-cutting legislation as a step toward peace and 60,000,000 jobs.

The commerce secretary, ex-vice president and former secretary of agriculture exchanged frequent verbal shots with Representative Knutson, Minnesota, ranking committee Republican, who sought to inquire into Wallace's general philosophy.

Early days of the new deal were recalled in the exchanges, with the Republicans dwelling on the "killing of little pigs" and the "blowing under of every third row."

In response to Knutson, Wallace vigorously denied he ever held a "philosophy of scarcity" and said the "third row" slogan was begun by the Republicans.
