

President Truman, announcing "a solemn but a glorious hour," set next Sun-day as a day of thanksgiving but reminded "our blows will continue until the Japanese lay down their arms in unconditional surrender." Prime Minister Churchill told the world the Germans had signed the unconditional surrender of all their land, sea and air forces in Europe at 2:41 a. m. yesterday.




