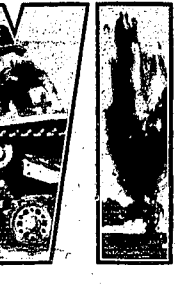

Quickest Route Revealed for Washing Slip Covers at Home

NEW YORK—Washing slippers from the wash tub to the hot steam of an iron have been worked out by experts to make it a cinch for you to launder that disagreeable lawn laundry—the slip cover.

Shake Before Washing
Before washing the brass and blake. Into a tub filled one-fourth full of warm—never hot—water, pour one-third package of Suiing flakes and work these into suds. Use the Suiing flakes in the tub. The bluing action, cushioned by soap, which softens dirt, makes it easier to rub out from white backgrounds.

Build bluing suds up to a 2 or 3-inch height and to a foamy stiffness. Then dip the slip cover into the suds. Wash slip cover through two sets of suds. Then wash in plain water. If you use a wringer, loosen the tension so as to ease slip cover into the wringer. Then dip the slip cover into the bluing liquid. The bluing action, cushioned by soap, which softens dirt, makes it easier to rub out from white backgrounds.

Search Lightly, This helps restore the color of the slip cover. It is your starch you'll discard a wax.



The product—one quarter of this specially prepared stuff keeps an iron from sticking—you will be able to iron your slip cover while it still damp, thus saving yourself the chore of wringing, rolling up and working the iron through the wringer. Then dip the material away from seams and iron with a pressing iron. Use one through flannels, cast, back and arms, through, turn over and finish on the inside on two parallel lines.

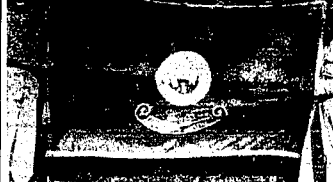
