Security Council Has New Quarrel Started by Latins

SAN FRANCISCO, May 14 (AP)—The dispute over regional defense systems blew wide open today with charges that Latin American countries are threatening to "destroy the world organization at its birth."

The blow came from Australian Foreign Minister Herbert V. Evatt in a speech denouncing the Latin American campaign to give the Pan-American security system authority from the world organization being set up by the United Nations conference.

Evatt said that Australia was being forced into a position of being a "subservient" to the proposals of the Latin American group. He said that the United States was being forced to operate directly under the security council of the world organization, and that this was a "subservient" position for the United States.

The attitude of this army, but to results of faulty judgment of individual officers, will be personally and severely reprimanded with expressions of my definite disapproval."

The supreme commander's statement was made following widespread rumors appearing in the British and American press to treatment of Reichsmarschall Hermann Goering.

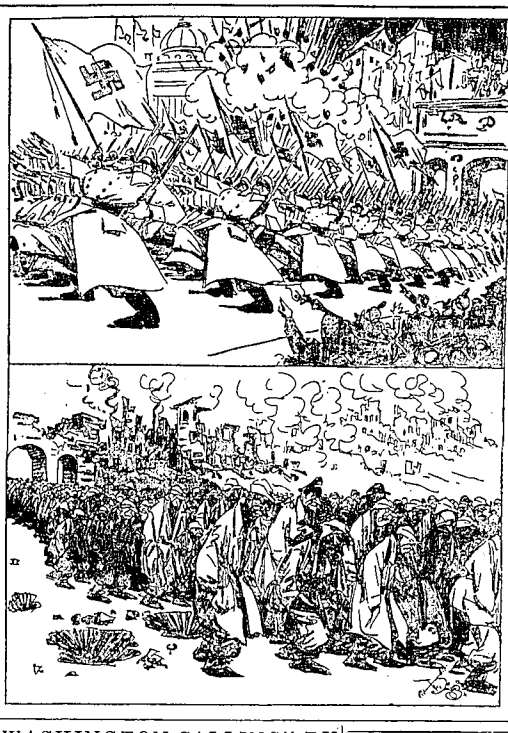

CHURCHILL AGAIN SAVES BEAT JAPAN

He Has "Political Item" Hobby, And He's National President

LONDON, May 14 (AP)—Efforts of the British empire were pledged by Prime Minister Churchill today to the twin tasks of perfecting the peace organization of the United Nations and to joining with the United States in inflicting total defeat upon Japan.

Mr. Churchill, in a world-wide broadcast address last night, made it plain that with those tasks ahead he does not intend to relinquish voluntarily the reins of government.

He attacked the Irish government of Premier Eamon de Valera for remaining neutral in inflicting total defeat upon Germany, asserting "if it had not been for the loyalty and friendship of northern Ireland, we should have been forced to close our quarters with Mr. De Valera or perish forever from the earth."

Mr. Churchill also stated that he has been planning to use the multiple long-range artillery against London, in addition to rockets and flying bombs.
