### YANKS MOVE IN ON YUGOSLAVIA

LONDON, May 22 (AP) — British and American forces in the Balkans have begun moving east toward the Yugoslav border today, in effect fulfilling the demand that Yugoslav troops be withdrawn from Venetia Giulia province.

The western allies gradually are taking over possession of a number of high peaks and other key positions that have not been occupied by the Yugoslavs.

Yugoslav occupation forces, partisans and civil administrators for the most part occupied only towns when they marched into Venetia Giulia, leaving the surrounding country unguarded.

The action may bring a showdown in the ticklish Yugoslav situation. It was decided by Marshal Tito rejected the demand that Yugoslav occupation forces be withdrawn from Venetia Giulia.

The province was awarded to Italy after the last war, but now is claimed by Yugoslavia. Alexander contends that allied troops should occupy the area until its final disposition has been decided at the peace conference.

### Pioneer of Carey Valley Succumbs

HALLEY, May 22—Joseph Andrew Smith, 72, pioneer resident of the Carey valley and known to Halley residents as "Doc," died at 4 p. m. Monday at the Halley district hospital where he was taken after suffering following a paralytic stroke.

Born Sept. 27, 1872, at Tooele, Utah, he came with his family to Wood River in 1880. It was the first white family to settle the Carey valley.

Before coming to Halley three years ago, Mr. Smith had farmed in Carey and was a member of the L. D. S. church.

Surviving are three brothers, Lafayette Smith, Carey; Almon Smith, Los Angeles; Clarence Smith, Petrolia, Calif.; and a sister, Mary Ann Smith, Blackfoot.

Services will be conducted at 2 p. m. Thursday at the L. D. S. church in Carey. Burial will be in the Carey cemetery under the direction of the Harris funeral home in Halley.

Lieutenant Webb, who was a navigator on a Flying Fortress, was taken prisoner by the Germans in a mission camp near Bauth, Germany.

Mr. and Mrs. Webb were recently informed by the war department of the death of another son, First Lieut. Kenneth Webb, killed May 2 on Luzon.

BUHL, May 22—Lieut. Warren R. Ellison piloted a P-51 Mustang in the first of the seventh fighter command's attack against mainland Japanese installations after recovering from wounds suffered March 20 on two Jinas.

The 25-year-old pilot has received the purple heart for his wounds, sustained during a dog battle charge on Iwo.

In the fighter command's first attack on Japan from the newly won two airfields, the target was at Kanyo on Kyushu, the most southern of the empire's islands. The fighters flew through heavy antiaircraft and ground fire to strafe airfield installations. A number of Jap planes were destroyed in the raid which was carried out in conjunction with the navy.

Lieutenant Ellison's parents are Mr. and Mrs. L. E. Ellison. Both he and his brother, Tom, graduated from Castleford high school in 1943 and attended the Air-Bus Normal before entering the armed forces in February of 1943.

HOLLYWOOD, May 22 (AP) — Crooner Frank Sinatra flew to New York under army orders with 30 priority, the USO announced today. Sinatra reported that all two Jina veteran lost his plane seat to the screen and radio star.

Sinatra had been selected for an overseas USO tour to entertain troops and was traveling under army orders, a USO spokesman said.

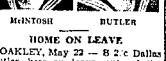

### NAVY REOPENING V-5 AIR PROGRAM

The naval aviation preparatory training program is again open to a limited number of civilian high school graduates, John D. Platt, principal of Twin Falls high school, announced Monday. Platt received the information from the 13th naval district, Seattle.

The graduates must meet the following qualifications: They must be 17 years old and single; of good standing in the community; able to pass navy flight physical and aptitude tests and have 20/20 eyesight.

Other Requirements The applicant must agree to remain on active duty for four years from the date of his transfer to the fleet he acquires the grade of aviation cadet, including the period he undergoes training, unless sooner released by the navy department.

Mr. Platt stressed that the information pointed out naval aviation recruits receive the most thorough and complete flight training offered anywhere in the world.

Accepted youths will be ordered to college July 1, 1945, for anticipated three-year terms, after which they will be assigned to flight training as naval aviation cadets, after enlistment in Denver.

### 26 Weeks' Training

Training will include 26 weeks in a naval pre-flight school, physical conditioning and sports at St. Mary's university, the University of Iowa, the University of North Carolina or the University of Georgia.

Football, basketball, basketball, swimming, an obstacle course, Judo, boxing and wrestling will be included.

On graduation, golden wings of a naval or marine aviator in the naval reserve or in the marine corps reserve will be awarded.

Plying officers in the navy and marine corps are paid approximately \$200 a month, including allowances.

NATIONAL MARITIME DAY

With the twelfth observance of National Maritime Day on May 22, it once again became this country's privilege to salute the men and women who built and sail our merchant ships.

The wartime surge of the United States merchant marine is one of its magnificent achievements. In 1919 the United States fleet ranked second to Great Britain with about 11,000,000 deadweight tons of shipping.

Our new position is a problem as well as a matter of pride. We can, as the British ambassador, Lord Halifax, said in a speech last fall, "lead the economic life of the world into a mad scramble."

They are large matters. Indeed, affecting domestic employment, international relations, world trade and world peace, this country's plan for seeing that there is enough on the plate for everybody has not been taken concrete form.

But the maritime commission has promised that we shall not use our fleet to the detriment of the legitimate needs of other nations whose life blood is international commerce.

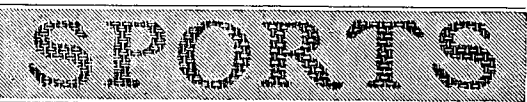

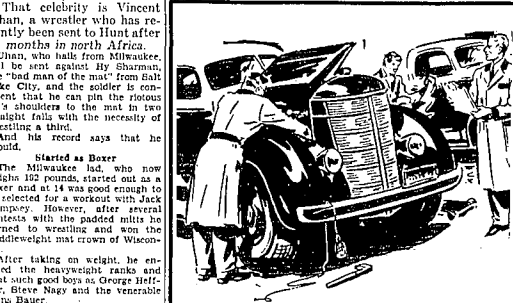
