PARLEY HAS NEW ROW COMING UP

SAN FRANCISCO, June 15 (AP)—The small boats which lost the fight to modify the big five vetoed demanded today that the United Nations charter guarantee them another chance within five to 10 years.

They sought a specific provision making it mandatory to hold a constitutional convention for revision of the charter not sooner than five years nor later than 10.

The big powers favor provision for such a convention but oppose the specific time reference. The little nations show no sign of yielding claiming it is "the certainty of such a convention that they want."

That controversy and the related dispute over the right of a member to quit the organization, threatened another delay in adjournment plans. Votes on the issues may come today.

A lot of work must be done that if the conference is to adjourn June 23 as planned.

The committee the farthest behind in its work is the one which must reach decisions not only on the constitutional convention but also on expulsion and the re-organization of the United Nations. It is expected to get bogged down in debate. The one on the preamble, principles and purposes got so involved in discussion of one phrase yesterday that the discussions were carried over to today.

IDAHO GAINER BY MEAT RATE CUT

WASHINGTON, June 14 (AP)—Midwest meat packers won their plea today for a reduction in freight rates on shipments of fresh meats and packing-house products to the Pacific coast.

The Interstate Commerce commission ordered a reduction of about 35 cents in rates on carload shipments of fresh meats minimum 21,000 pounds and on packing-house products (minimum 30,000 pounds) from points in Illinois, Wisconsin, Nebraska, Colorado and South Dakota to Los Angeles, San Francisco, New Mexico, Utah, Idaho, Arizona, Nevada, California, Oregon and Washington.

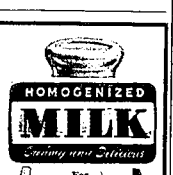

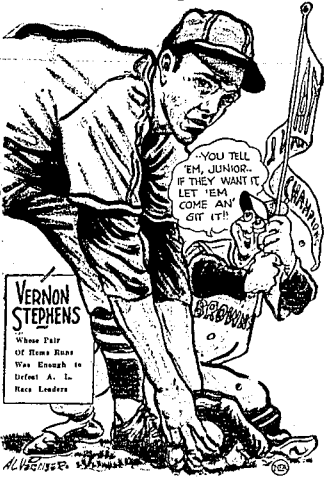

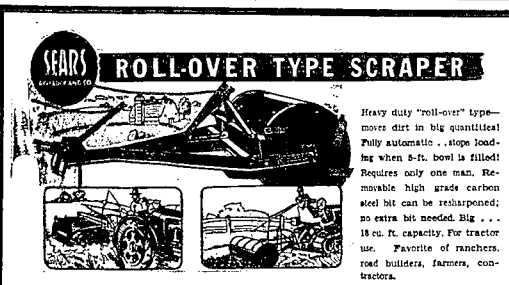

WE FLEW WITH GUNS

Six of us were sitting around the battered old table in the bamboo shack that served as pilot's office at the Chungking Hotel of China National Aviation Corporation. The cold fog settling slowly over the city had driven most of the indoors except the mechanics and field attendants who were refueling our planes.

I was #112 in the hole—I remember this distinctly. It was just the beginning of a bad run of luck at stud poker. Bob Robertson was sitting at the table with a Chinese boy named Wang Chung. Wang had a heavy margin over the table. He had a stack of lettuce in front of him like the harvest from a West gate back home. Eddie Quinn, also Chinese and co-pilot on Capt. Al Gingham's ship, was a little bit of a muffed, impatient Tex., my co-pilot, and young Tui was at the bottom of our pockets. By every law of chance, it seemed to me, one of us was about due for a winning hand. So it was an awkward time to hear Flight Superintendent Potemkin shouting: "Captain Gingham! Hey, Gen! And there's a muffed, impatient Tex. 'Where the hell is that guy?' 'Potty' was a big man, about 40, with a thick head of hair and a hand his deck with his hands in his pockets. His blond head had tilted down to look at me. In fact, my five feet eight inches looked pretty small among those of the boys flying across the Himalaya Hump between the Chinese Yunnan province, and Assam, India.

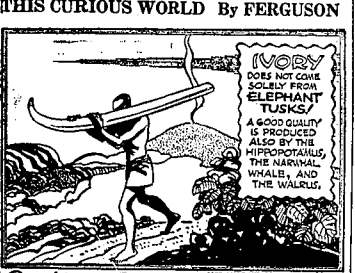

China National doesn't pay for pleasure. There were no tourists among these 32 passengers. Aside from two Allied generals I had flown before, there were many high Chinese officers and a few civilians. Among the latter I recognized confidential adviser to Gen. Chiang Kai-shek and a foreign-office big shot. They were all people that really deserved to get where they were going, and I wished to hell that it wasn't my responsibility to get them there.

I checked with Potemkin just before taking off and said I would fly the north route. 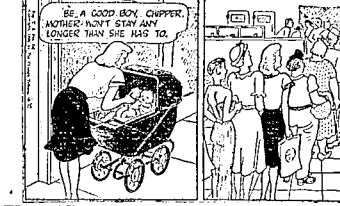

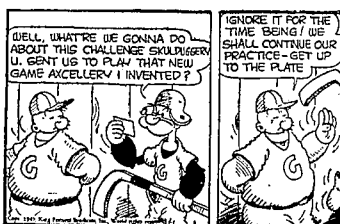

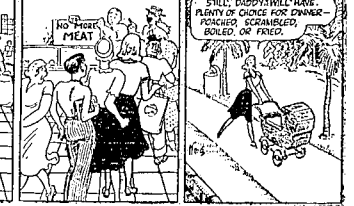
