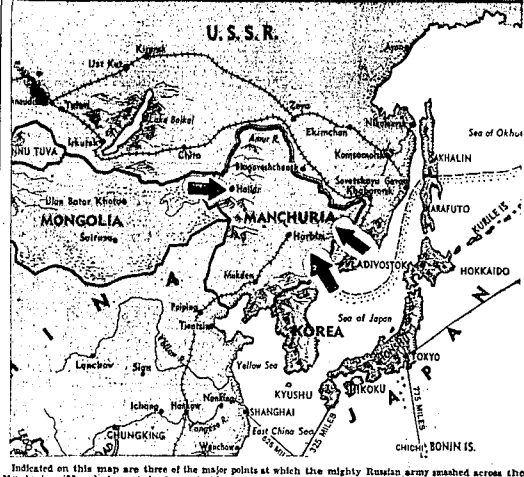

## 1,200 Halsey Carrier Planes Rip at Japan

GUAM, Friday, Aug. 10 (AP)—Adm. William F. Halsey's third fleet, again contributing to the "rain of ruin" on Japan, unleashed 1,200 carrier planes against industrial centers of Honshu in a continuing raid yesterday and more than 30 Superfortresses struck at the vast Nippon Oil refinery near Osaka early today.

The Superforts heaped demolition bombs on the refinery and tank farm area at Amagasaki, one of the largest producers of fuel for nippon's battered war machine. Amagasaki already had been 11 per cent destroyed in a raid July 10, and another 10 per cent destroyed in a raid July 17. The Japanese city is "damaged" by the Japanese, presumably to escape aerial destruction.

Simultaneously Gen. Carl Spaatz, commander of the strategic air force, announced that the most complete devastation ever brought about by any Japanese city by high explosive bomb was visited on Toyama on southern Honshu a week ago.

Toyko said a fleet of B-29's led this afternoon attacked industrial targets around the metropolitan area and that American warships earlier thrust within 10 to 20 miles of the Japanese coast to block Kamakura, steel center in northeast Honshu.

Toyko identified the targets of the Superforts as Oil Shima, Ogibaru and Tama, the industrial heart of Toyko. Part of the force attacked Honshu.

Spaatz said 92.5 per cent destruction of 100 Japanese cities and an oil refinery hit by 800 Superforts Aug. 8.

Further reports from yesterday's strike by 25 Superforts against Yawata, Japan's "Pittsburgh" showed the B-29's had to dodge flash for 200 miles on their way to the target. The target was the industrial heart in yesterday's four-way strike showed heavy damage to Japan's aviation industry.

## Truman Calls For Meet on Atomic Bomb

WASHINGTON, Aug. 9 (AP)—President Truman called to top military, diplomatic and scientific advisers today to discuss the atomic bomb whose terrific destructive effect was being demonstrated in Japan.

Secretary of War Stimson cancelled a regular news conference to supervise the meeting. He took with him Maj. Gen. Leslie Groves, who supervised the atomic project which harnessed for the first time the energy of the atomic bomb.

Secretary of State Byrnes, who heads the War Relocation Authority, also was invited to attend yesterday.

Others present included scientists who played a leading part in developing the reconversion program.

## Public Jitters Over Atomic Bomb Unjustified by Facts

NEW YORK, Aug. 9 (AP)—The public's jitters over the atomic bomb are not justified, either by the official facts from Washington or by the scientific records of the discovery.

It is a scientific fact that the energy in the complete explosion of one pound of uranium could blow the Empire State building 20 miles into the air.

It is possible, as unofficially reported, that 11 pounds of uranium are used in the present atomic bomb.

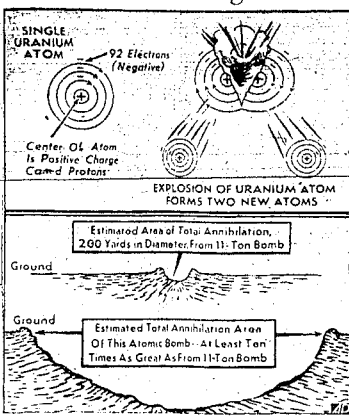
