U.S.S. MISSOURI, Tokyo Bay, Sunday, Sept. 2 (AP)rendered formally and unconditionally to the allies today in a 20-minute ceremony which ended just as the sun burst through low-hanging clouds as a shining symbol to a ravaged world now done with war.

The solemn ceremony, marking the first defeat in Japan's 2,600-year-old semi-legendary history, took place aboard this mighty battleship with 12 signatures which required only a few minutes to affix to the articles of sur-
