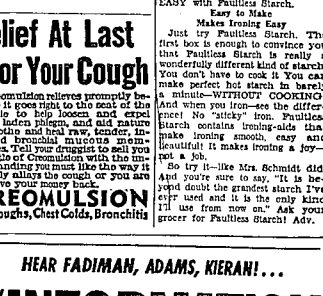

PROVE THE TRENDS AT MUNICIPAL GOLF COURSE PLANNED

New Clubhouse, Road, No. 5 Hole Mapped

When the golfers return to the Twin Falls municipal course next week, they probably will find a layout of plans for the one that they left Sunday when the curtain was rung down officially on the season by Fred Stone, course manager.

Information obtained by the Times-News sports department reveals that the following items are contemplated in the municipal course:

- 1. A new clubhouse.
- 2. A different house for the caretaker.
- 3. A new road into the course.
- 4. A more difficult No. 5 hole.
- 5. A practice green.

According to the plans contemplated, the stone house now housing the caretaker will be moved into a clubhouse. This will take quite a bit of remodeling but it is felt that it will be a more acceptable building than the city can afford to build.

The caretaker will be provided with a new house or a house moved to the course.

The old road into the course has proved entirely inadequate. For one thing it is a narrow alleyway with traffic over it and has been hard to locate.

Peace Hinge Seen in Asia Rail System

By JAMES D. WHITE
SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 22 (AP)—Peace in the Pacific and the world may come day depend upon Chinese and Russians working together in operating a vital transmanchurian railway under a strange and complex new agreement.

The rail system is one of the keys to political and economic domination of eastern Asia. The agreement for its operation is manifestly designed to interlock the personal relationships of the Russian and Chinese administrators to such an extent that anything but cooperation would be unprofitable so long as their governments remain friendly.

This agreement is one of its highly important treaties signed between Moscow and Chungking in August, designed to reset important relations between the two nations, and remaining power in Asia.

Behind this series lies the intricate background of Russian-Chinese relations, echoes of which can be discerned in the new treaties. Russians and Chinese first ran into each other—settling trouble—about 1911, and since then have been clashing on Peking's roof. The emperor of China at the time was the great Kiang Kai, a Manchurian potentate whose Chinese subjects resented violently through the eyes of eastern Siberia looking for gold and for Chinese medicines such as deer-horn, tiger-bones and bear-tails.

Trappers in Trouble
Russian trappers, headed by a secret agent named Kishinoff, used to roam trouble with three Chinese. The result was a series of negotiations, signed in 1923. The Chinese wanted everything east of Lake Baikal.

The Russians wanted everything down to the Amur river. Each side feared and hated the other, so they compromised, setting the boundary considerably north of the Amur.

This situation lasted until 1935 when the great Kiang Kai, a Manchurian potentate whose Chinese subjects resented violently through the eyes of eastern Siberia looking for gold and for Chinese medicines such as deer-horn, tiger-bones and bear-tails.

By 1898 the Russians were trying to complete the trans-Siberian railway, and wanted to run a cutoff through Manchuria which would save several hundred miles. The czar prevailed upon the Chinese to let him build it, and later a branch line down to Dairen as well.

The line was chartered by Russia as the Chinese eastern railway. It had a Chinese president, and a Russian and Chinese stockholders, and was operated by a Russian board of directors. Joint control again.

When Japan won her war with Russia in 1905, and in 1905 she bought the trans-Siberian line from Soviet Russia, in Manchuria which China protested as illegal.

100 Million Volt X-Rayer Is Developed

NEW YORK, Oct. 22 (AP)—A hundred million volt X-ray machine, far the most powerful ever made, has been announced by the General Electric company. The project has been about 20,000,000 volts.

The machine called a betatron, is a new tool for some of the unsolved questions about how to produce useful power, instead of bombs, from explosive uranium, plutonium and other atoms.

The betatron is a big glass vacuum tube, shaped like a flattened doughnut, six feet in diameter. It is placed between the two poles of a big electromagnet. It also has a grid of anode, and both poles are even wider than the tube.

An electric filament produces electrons, which are shot into the tube. Once inside, the electrons are caused to curve by the magnetic field between the huge poles. They fly round and round making circuits of the circular tube.

At the same time an alternating electrical current causes them to speed up, until they are traveling at 99.99 per cent of light's speed of 186,000 miles a second. At this speed they are converted to hit a block of tungsten metal. This impact produces X-rays.

A silver dollar, set in thin rays for a few minutes, will afterward emit rays like sodium. The dollar rays last only a few minutes. They come from atoms of silver and of copper in the coin which the powerful X-rays transmuted.

Some of the silver is transmuted into another metal, palladium, and the latter emits rays for a short time. The copper is transmuted into nickel, which also emits rays temporarily.

These transmutations are part of the experiments that are being performed in seeking to use uranium or other chemical elements as sources of atomic power. The rays from the silver drill up too weak to produce heat or power of any kind.

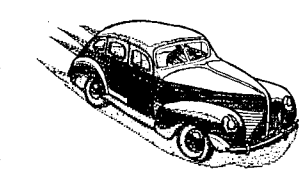
