Here's How New Tax-Cut Will Affect Your Wages

WASHINGTON, Oct. 29 (AP)—Here's how the new income tax bill would reduce pay—by withdrawing from the work paycheck of a married man with no children: If he earns \$1 a week, the government would take nothing from his pay now. It will take 10 cents if he earns \$20. The deduction will be zero, against a present deduction of 20 cents a week; if \$25, a 70-cent deduction instead of \$1.10; \$30—\$1.60 instead of \$2.20. \$35—\$2.40 instead of \$3.20; \$40—\$3.20 instead of \$4.00; 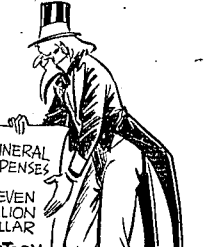
