

Battle Is Started on Draft Bill

WASHINGTON, Nov. 8 (AP)—Congressmen got into a scrap over universal military training today after Secretary of War Patterson said it is essential to American security and world peace.

Patterson testified before the House military committee. As he finished, Representative Short, R. Mo., popped a surprise motion picture in consideration of training bill not yet near or at least until the senate has voted. The movie was blocked on a technical rule, however.

The Missouriian said he had back with his motion picture. He told reporters:

"I say this bill is dead. It would be dead right now if we had been allowed to vote this morning."

Patterson contended that the only justification for requiring every young American to give a year of his life to military training is that it is needed to give the United States security and make possible for us to undertake world peace.

Chinese Reds Demand U. S. Apology; Order Withdrawal of Chiang Troops

(CHUNGKING, Nov. 8 (AP)—Chinese communists demanded today that Lieut.-Gen. Albert C. Wedemeyer, U. S. commander in China, apologize and that compensation be paid for alleged American "interference" in China's internal struggle.

The Reds also demanded that Chiang government troops withdraw from all red-dominated areas and that the government, instead, was planning an offensive for which 30 divisions were being massed in the north.

The demand for Wedemeyer's apology was contained in one of four protesting letters sent to the American commander by the communists' Yanan headquarters.

The communists at Yanan called the "interference" government claims that the Reds had been and would remain strictly on the defensive. More than 10 government divisions have massed in "liberated" areas of Honan province, and Hongkong is surrounded by more than 20 government divisions, the communists asserted.

The world's largest machine gun and mortar plant is here and No. 2 Chinese negotiator General Yen Hsien-shan has returned to the Yanan area after reports that the Russians had withdrawn from the Manchurian provinces of Heilung and Shantung (Chiang leaving the Chinese Reds in control) and the already tense situation.

Chiang said the communists demanded that the government withdraw troops to positions outside the "liberated" areas and that the government should be sure the civil fighting should be ended.

Representative communist spokesmen told the government to stop the government's military operations and to negotiate with the government.

"The situation," he added, "appears dangerous."

Other government spokesmen were:

U.S. Steel Raps Truman Wage Policies at Labor Conference

Fairless said that the government's additional steel price increases—10 percent for the steel industry—would be needed and the corporation, he stated, will insist on assurances from OPA that the price ceiling will be maintained with any wage hike.

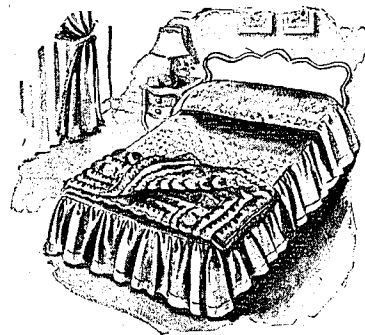

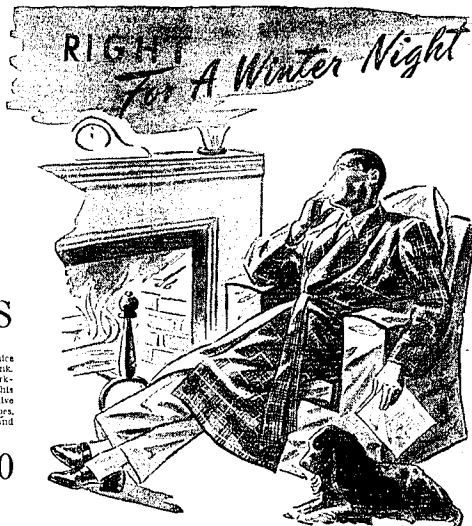
