Buick Hit By Labor Stoppage

By The Associated Press Buick automobile production was halted today by the CIO United Automobile Workers district General Motors statement that a "work stoppage" was the cause.

Five thousand persons were involved in the strike and the closing of the Fisher Body assembly line. This brought to 275,000 the number of persons on strike or indirectly involved in labor disputes over the nation.

In a prepared statement General Motors said it had been advised by the UAW that the "stoppage" was the cause. The company said it would stop the supply of chassis frames.

The UAW said in Cleveland there was a strike at Midland plant but that the company had discharged 250 workers at Buick, Buehler and Hudson from the plant two weeks ago because the company "didn't like the amount of production."

General Motors said the production affected one-third of the 18,000 employed in Buick and Fisher plants and the other two-thirds to 20,000 in the other plants.

The wage dispute between the United States Steel workers and the CIO United Steel workers came to an end as the company announced that it would give a 10 percent wage increase and a new pension plan.

# Wage Slashes Flight Chief in Bomber Group Gets Discharge Of Many Jobs

WASHINGTON, Nov. 14 (AP)—Sharply reduced wage offerings are cited by the government as a principal reason why available jobs go unfilled while more than 1,300,000 are looking for work.

The United States employment service, in a survey of three cities, said that typical, and today that if job seekers accepted available work they would receive a cut in take-home pay averaging from 34 to 40 per cent for men, and from 23 to 25 per cent for women.

Explaining, USES said the lower-skilled jobs available pay lower wages, and a further cut resulted from reduction of the workweek from 48 to 40 hours.

The USES has these other reasons in answering the question: "Why are there large numbers of workers seeking employment when there are also large numbers of job openings?"

1. The labor market was inflated during the war by inclusion of many workers who had learned only a simple skill.

2. There are few, if any, peacetime jobs calling for these limited skills.

3. A sharp reduction in the number of jobs available in the skilled categories.

4. Most available jobs are for men while most of the job-seekers are women.

# Flight Chief in Bomber Group Gets Discharge

FAIRVIEW, Nov. 14 — 77841 Donald E. Carman, youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. Hewell Carman, has received his honorable discharge at Ft. Lewis, Wash.

An airplane mechanic, he enlisted Aug. 5, 1941, at Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, and served as a flight chief with the 320th bomber squadron.

He participated in the campaigns in the northern Solomons, New Guinea, southern Philippines, China, and against the western Pacific.

He wears the American theater service ribbon with clasps, the American defense ribbon, good conduct medal, Asiatic-Pacific service ribbon and Philippine liberation medal with one bronze service star.

He was assigned to a 20-day leave with his wife and parents. He was on annual leave in February, 1942, while at the University of Idaho from where he was graduated in 1941.

In August, 1943, he entered officer's training in Illinois, and in December was assigned to a post at Portland, Ore. He was sent to Seattle in March, 1944, on an LST gunboat. He wears three campaign stars—Marianas, Palau and Okinawa and one bronze star.

His unit received two naval citations. His ship never received a casualty although the other ship was hit in the first battle. He will report to Seattle in December for further orders. His wife will accompany him there.

# Cow's Blood May Stop Hemorrhage

CINCINNATI, Nov. 14 (AP)—An extract from cow's blood, immersed in a "gelatin sponge," provides a means in the control of hemorrhages in head and nerve surgery, the Southern Medical association was told today.

Dr. Cobb Fletcher of Vanderbilt university said in a prepared paper that for some time the thrombin, or blood-clotting agent of bovine blood had offered possibilities of controlling bleeding, but that no first a means of applying it to bleeding points was lacking.

That lack was filled recently by other investigators, he said. They developed a "sponge" made of gelatin. Thrombin in liquid form can be caught up by the sponge and then applied to a bleeding point. The gelatin is absorbed within the body, leaving the thrombin to do its blood-clotting work.

### Allies Raze \$70,000,000 Reich Plant

By DON DOANE  
 BREMEN, Germany, Nov. 14 (AP)—The \$70,000,000 Goetz factory-controlled nitrocellulose plant which fed the most war machine fuel in the world was razed today by the Allies. The plant, which was built up by the Allies continued their demolition of the German war industry.

In a single spectacular explosion the plant's two major units—a five-story nitrate building and a power station—were reduced to rubble. They went up in a sheet of flame followed by an earthshaking explosion which knocked down nearby buildings and sent clouds of dust smothering into the sky.

Like the Farben powder plant at Kaubertzen which was wrecked by the Allies in 1944, the plant here was a subsidiary of the Farben plant. The 2,300 workers during the war produced 100,000 tons of nitrocellulose and 350 tons of nitro cellulose powder monthly until it was damaged for the first time by allied bombers last April.

### Jap. Germans May Build up China Plants

NEW YORK, Nov. 14 (AP)—A possibility that Japanese and German factories in occupied China might be called on for the building up of China industry was revealed today by Clarence E. Claus, former United States ambassador to China.

In his first public statement since he left Chungking for Washington, Claus asserted the Chinese government was making it extremely difficult for American and British interests to do business with nationals of China.

In his first press conference since he left Chungking, Claus said he thought that the "present attitude of Chinese officials" was such that they felt that the entry of foreign capital into China is an effort to restore the old extra-territorial status.

"There is no small emphasis on speed in building up China as an industrial and exporting country," he said. "Agriculture is needed first, then, if the expansion of industry is a gradual process, there will be no need for large loans."

Robert P. Loring, vice president of the Guaranty Trust company of New York, asserted that American property holders who had cooperated with the allies during the war are now being "robbed of their properties after the absolute is over." He did not mention any specific nation as responsible but added:

"If for one should think Congress would be reluctant to extend credit to those nations who feel themselves justified in nationalizing or appropriating the property of American corporations and American citizens without prompt and adequate dollar, there is certainly no payment in German marks or other foreign currencies to be converted into dollars at some future date. It is not adequate or satisfactory compensation."

Loring, a former president of the federal export bank, assured that the institution would not operate against their interests and that there will be more opportunities for constructive international financing offered than at any time in the history of the world.

He said that the United States has many opportunities in trading raw materials for finished goods with Russia and other nations.

"While the USSR approach is possibly unimproved, it is nevertheless fundamentally sound."

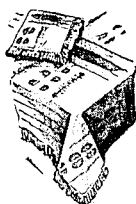

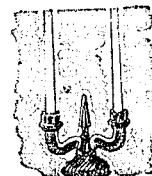
