NIERNBERG, Nov. 20 (AP)—A score of young, odd-looking henchmen of Adolf Hitler went on trial for their part today before the International Military Tribunal and heard the reading of the lengthy indictment against them—a recital of plunder and blood.

It appeared that completion of the reading of the 35,000-word document would require the remainder of the day.

Chief of the prosecution, British lawyer Geoffrey Lawrence, presiding, announced the trial would continue without adjournment.

From the opening points of the trial, it was clear that the prosecution was going to rely heavily on the testimony of British and American soldiers who were present at the trial.

There were no legal fireworks at the trial today.

This trial which is about to be the first in the history of jurisprudence to be broadcast to people all over the world.

The program is being broadcast on the radio and television.

General Motors Rejects Final Offer of Union

DETROIT, Nov. 20 (AP)—The General Motors council of the CIO Automobile Workers union today recommended a strike in the plants of General Motors corporation.

The union's latest move in its drive to obtain a 30 per cent wage increase for auto workers was its proposal to submit for arbitration, General Motors had until 4 p. m. today to reply to the delegates to the CIO-UAW, representing more than 300,000 workers.

The long and bitter wage dispute between the CIO United Automobile Workers and General Motors corporation appeared headed for another showdown today, strike action, which would affect some 300,000 of the nation's automobile workers, was regarded as possible by union spokesmen.

Hearings on North Idaho Dam Started

COEUR D'ALENE, Ida., Nov. 20 — Hearings on the proposed \$25,000,000 Springdale dam in north Idaho began here today, with more than 100 persons in attendance.

The hearing, called by the corps of engineers, will be directed by Col. Conrad P. Hardy of Seattle, district engineer, and consulting engineers Maj. C. A. Jackson and H. H. Hutcherson, also of Seattle.

Representatives of the Coeur d'Alene mining district are expected to read the opposition. And residents of the Coeur d'Alene valley, whose homes would be flooded by the back waters, have indicated they would present strong opposition.

The mining interests' main objection to the project is that the huge lake to be formed by the dam would cover the big Osburn fault, causing seepage into the mine workings which might endanger the future of the entire mining district.

Colonel Hardy, who arrived in Spokane last night, said proponents of the project would be heard first. He indicated they would substantiate the engineers' claim that benefits of the project would be on a three-to-one ratio over a period of 50 years.

The engineers claim that seepage would eliminate all danger of flood on Coeur d'Alene lake and the Spokane river, provide water storage for irrigation of existing and proposed irrigation districts, "firm up" power at existing power plants downstream, and lower the cost of log transportation.

Proposed site for the dam is on the Coeur d'Alene river at Springdale. Specifications call for an earth and rock filled dam 130 feet above the valley floor, 2,700 feet long and 1,200 feet wide, with a capacity of 2,825,000 acre-feet of water.

The reservoir would be approximately 34 miles long and cover more than 31,000 acres.

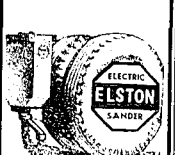

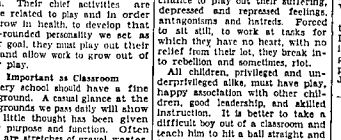

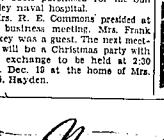

Duck hunting weather is here but the ducks aren't hunters who went out during the week-end discovered. Only a few brook trout ducks. Amount of any fish, birds or game in storage may not exceed the local limit, the department pointed out. In the case of game, most kept in lockers metal tags attached to the carcass at the time of killing should be left with the meat.

Waste is not tolerated, of course. Stale meat of game or fish is frowned upon by conservationists and common sense. Deer and grouse, which come under federal regulation, may be kept 90 days after the shooting season, last day of the migratory waterfowl hunt in Idaho is December 31. The 90-day possession period this season is twice as long as it was a year ago.

Report On the War

JAPAN'S OBJECTIVES

Not only were the European participants of the axis unable to coordinate their plans and resources and agree within their own nations how to proceed, but the eastern partner, Japan, was working in even greater disorder. The axis, as a whole, existed on paper only. Eager to capitalize on the preoccupation of the western powers in Europe, Japan was so greedy for her own immediate conquest that she hid her strategy, not to help Germany defeat Russia and Great Britain, but to accumulate her own profit. Had the way been open Germany and Japan would have undoubtedly joined their armies in central Asia, but to Japan this objective was secondary to being the far east while there was no real force to stop her. The war department general staff's analysis of Japanese objectives follows:

1. The Japanese, for many years, bolstered by a fanatical belief in divine guidance and their own spiritual and military supremacy, had planned the domination of the far east and eventually the world.

Strategically, Japan was well prepared in 1941 to carry out her plan in Asia. All the major world powers who normally maintained the status quo in Asia were absorbed in the war in Europe. France had been overrun and eliminated. England had become the arsenal of democracy, with major efforts directed toward the support and protection of our European allies.

The Luce-Peterson pact had been signed, giving Japan a free hand in Asia. She had a large and relatively well-equipped army and a moderately good air force well trained by actual combat in China.

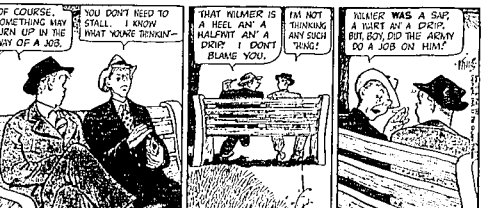
