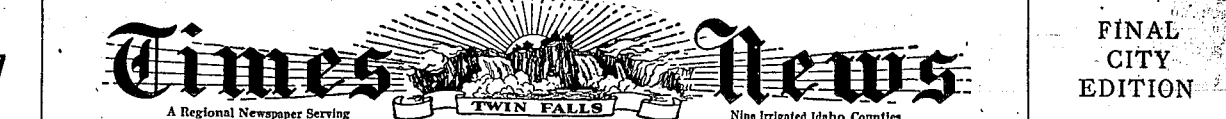

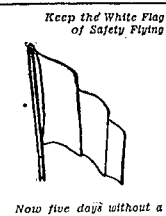

Report On the War

By General George C. Marshall

Biennial Report of the Chief of Staff of the U. S. Army

Published by the War Department, in cooperation with the Army of the Air

This is the eighth of 14 installments of material selected from the General Marshall report on the winning of World War II.

ON TO THE BOAT
In the first two days of the invasion more than 500 men, 600 vehicles, and 300 tanks had landed; several small ports were opened for operations; at least six airfields had been captured and were being prepared for use.

By the time the Allies landed on the east coast of Sicily on the night of July 10, 1943, the Italian mainland had been threatened across the western end of the island occupied the key port of Palermo. Further east the Allies forged steadily ahead through rugged mountain stamboras.

On 8 September, the day before American troops landed on the Italian mainland, the unconditional surrender of Italy was announced. On September and the succeeding days the element of the Italian fleet surrendered.

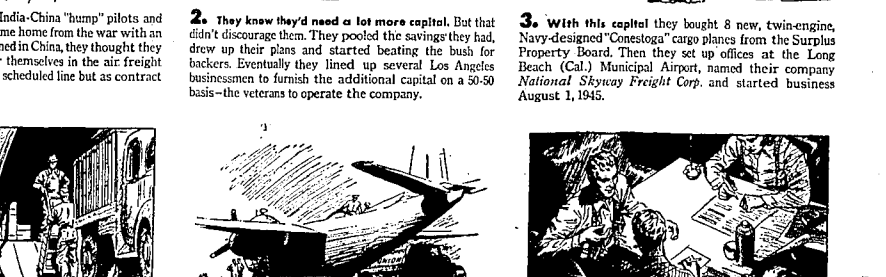
