# **Pearl Harbor Legal Chiefs** Quit, Barkley May Follow

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14 (U.P.)—The Pearl Harbor committee's legal staff resigned today with a charge of time-wasting and Chairman Alben W. Barkley, D., Ky., threatened to resign. Chief Counsel William D. Mitchell told the bause-sente investigating committee that he and his staff had not yet been permitted to present. He said the hearings were dragsing on much longer than he had expected them to and that he and his staff had not yet been permitted to present new data hitherto never made public. Barkley expressed regret at the legal staff's decision. He added, however, that the time also had come when he must determine whether his duties on the committee outweigh his reopossibilities as Democratic.
