Texas took the lead late in the first period by Layne's plunge over from the 100-yard line.

Missouri came roaring back to tie it up again midway of the second period, hammering from its 35 yard line to the three-yard stripe where Deltastasio blazed over.

But it wasn't long until Texas and Layne found themselves in the time to stay. With a 60-yard strike the Longhorns whipped to a touchdown with Layne shredding the defense on the one-foot stripe for the score. Texas drove further ahead.


