TUESDAY, Jan. 8.—The prince's business has fallen off something scandalous in Japan and things are so rough that the papers are saying that even these jobless brothers of Hirohito will have to go to work for a living.

All news agency made sort of an unpropitious comment on the imperial household and found that in all there were 17 princes over 20.

Business started to get hot, after lunch times in the palace, along about the time the imperial household began to number where that were being dumped outside the palace door.

"Then, first things anybody knew, why the emperor up and declared peace, and here were all these princes in uniform and all without a cent to their name."

And then the Americans came barging in, abolishing Japanese military outfit right and left, and the princes began looking for fresh employment.

Jerome's Tax Levies Jump During 1945

JEROME, Jan. 8.—Assessed valuations of Jerome county property was increased by \$235,122 in 1945 over 1944, according to an announcement by Mrs. Charlotte Robertson, Jerome county clerk, auditor and recorder. The actual increase in taxes amounted to \$94,231.68 for the same period.

Assessed valuations in 1945 amounted to \$7,521,201 as compared to \$7,286,079 in 1944. While charges levied in 1945 were \$39,689.97 as compared to \$48,923.65 in 1944.

County charges for the two years were listed as follows: The first figure is for the 1944 charge; the second figure is for 1945 charge: Current expense, \$30,087.82 and \$42,475.85; county school, \$22,969.86 and \$38,784.86; road act by county; charity and indigent, \$6,967.57 and \$2,200.18; courthouse land and interest, \$9,082.34 and \$2,010.76; seed production, \$1,031.18 and \$7,723.79; county fee, \$2,256.59 and \$7,733.65; high soil adjustment against county, none in 1944 and \$11,620.26 in 1945; tractors, \$4,572 in 1944 and none in 1945.

Total county charges in 1944 were \$25,239.46 as compared to \$124,186.29 in 1945.
