## Which is the UAW-CIO really after? Is it seeking facts-or new economic power? Does it want to know things - or run things? <br> These questions concern you as well as General Motors.

For years the facts about General Motors have been made public.

 Is DefinedThe Wagner Act lays down the rules for collective barrgaining. These cover such arces now rutes of pey, hoars of work, working conditions.
No mention is made of earnings, prices, salcs volume, taxes and the like. Those are rocognized as the problems of management.

4ra Something New has been Added The obvious fact is that the UAW.CIO has gone beyond its rights under the law-und is reaching not for information but for new power - not for a look at past figures, but for the power to sit in on forceasting and planning the future.
A "look at the books" is a clever catch phrase intended if an opening wedge whereby Unions hope to pry their way into the whole field of managernent.
It-leads-surely to the day when-Union bosses, under threat of strike, will demand the right to tell what we can make, when we can make it, where we can make it, and how much we must charge you-all with an eye on what labor can fake out of the business, rather than on the value that gocs into the product.
5. Thls Thraatens All Business

If the Union can do this in The case of General Motors, it can do it to every business in this land of ours.
Is this just imagination? Union spokesmen have said, "The Union has stated time after time that this issue is bigger than just an ordinary wage ardument, that it is bigger than the Corporation and bigger than the Union."
For Labor Unions to use the monopolistie power of their vast membership to extend the scope of wage negotiations to include more than wages, hours and working conditions is the first step toward handing the management of business over to the Union bosses.

## How do they do it?

Could you produce one-third more crops with $10 \%$ less manpower? The farmers of America did it during the last full year of the war

How? Partly by working themsetves and their machines loitger; liarder. Partly by assisting hired help with wired help.

Electricity has taken over more and more farm chores. It pumps water, grinds feed, cures hay, fills silos. It steps up milk and egs and pork production. It eases farm housework, too.

Cheap, dependable electricity has done more than any other force to make farming efficient and farm life comfortable.

Who elactrifed The farms? Rural electric service didn't happen overnight. It started more than 25 years ago-with America's business-managed electric companies. These companies did the pioneering-the pick-and-shovel work.

The advantages of electricity on the farm were many. The probjem was to get
it to the farmer. Distance and weather called for new methods and materins. New farm machines suitable for electric driva had to be developed.
Each problem was licked in turn by American initiative and ingenuity. Service grew steadily better and cheaper. Farm by farm, area by area, the web of wire expanded.

What of fomorrow? Today, businessmanaged electric companies serve $1,850,000$ farms (about two-thirds of all electrified farms) and more than $4,000,000$ other rural customers outside of incorborated towns That's real progress.
But the job isn't done. Right now, as fast as men and materials become available, these same companies are extending reliable, low-priced electric service to more than $1,000,000$ additional farm and rural non-farm customers. They are investing $\$ 290,000,000$ for construction alone

This program is under way right now.
