# French Press Gets Freedom Of Regulation

PARIS, Jan. 11.—One of the cardinal policies of the De Gaulle government is absolute freedom of the press, not only publication in France but also collection of news in this country to be printed abroad.

That has been one of the main aims of the French government since the end of the war. You can see anything you wish, always on condition, of course, that you are within the laws of libel and similar statutes.

**Real Freedom**  
These are days when the world is large to reaching out in a good dose of double talk—saying one thing and meaning another—but there is plenty of evidence to indicate that the French government means business when it talks of freedom of the press. Despite the shortage of newsprint, which has to be imported, and legitimate newspaper can be started.

So far as is known the government hasn't refused a single license for the starting of a newspaper. The result is that a wide freedom of the press in newspapers, which is said to be as it had before the war.

**Equal Opportunities**  
Naturally Paris can't support no more paper, and this is a good thing. A goodly number of papers are published by parties and groups. However, the government is giving everyone equal opportunities for the press. The government itself, by the way, is said to have no newspaper representation.

In order to prevent abuses of freedom of the press, the government is preparing a new press law, something France never had before. This will make obligatory for every newspaper to publish the names of all those who are backing a newspaper, so that the public can see who is behind it. This law, as projected, also will prevent the publishing of a newspaper by a foreign government.

**Heavy Punishments**  
Heavy punishments will be provided for accepting bribes to publish news, or for any similar violation. These will carry penalties running up to 10 years in prison.

The legislation for this drive for freedom of the press isn't hard to find. It is contained in the Frenchman's inner desire for freedom. But his innate desire had to be reinforced by the German occupation.

For five long years under the German rule there was no freedom of speech or publication.
