



# Case Goes to Jury; Lesser Charge Urged

A plea for a maximum verdict of a year in jail was made Friday morning in district court by Frank L. Rothoff, 40, Twin Falls. Rothoff is charged with assault with intent to injure Mrs. Mary H. Mann, 34, wife of a veteran. In his statement to the jury, Rothoff admitted that he believed the charge that Rothoff had attempted to injure Mann, but pleaded guilty to the lesser charge that he had attempted to injure her.

Both sides agreed that Mrs. Mann had not been injured. But the prosecution asked that the defendant had threatened to injure a community, although it was not a crime at the time when the assault was committed. Rothoff's attorney, Stephen, asked that the charge be reduced to a lesser charge, the charge of assault with intent to injure, which carries a maximum penalty of one year in jail.

The court accepted the plea and the case was set for trial on Feb. 15. Rothoff was held in lieu of \$5,000.
