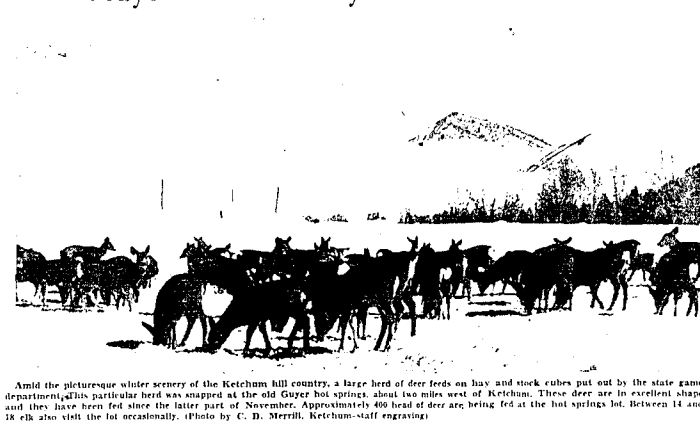

Congressmen Urge Strong Safeguards For A-Bomb Secret

WASHINGTON, Feb. 20 (AP)—Secretary of State Byrnes' assurance that the know-how of atomic bomb production remains an exclusive United States secret brought a renewed capital hill cry today of "knack it well."

In the wake of Canadian disclosures of atom secrets to a foreign spy ring, the congressional reaction to Byrnes' statement was a mixture of relief and admonition to make sure it can't happen here.

Safety to Be Chief Factor In Bomb Test

WASHINGTON, Feb. 20 (AP)—Operation crossroads is giving top priority to safety precautions for the 25,000 men who will take part in the atom bomb test at Bikini atoll.

The safety corps is relying on the fogger counter and on the knowledge gained from previous A-bomb explosions. The fogger counter is a tell-tale electronic device, reports the presence of radioactivity either in the air or in such solid substances as the steel of a ship's deckplates.

The corps is built around a group of men who are present at the first test of the atom bomb in New Mexico last summer. There they made observations of the clouds, the radioactive cloud and recordings of residual activity in the ground of the bomb blast area.

Task force officials said these men "have a pretty definite idea of how this cloud behaves—how long it retains its deadly content, how it moves, how far it drifts before dissipating. They have plotted the probable air drift and made accurate recommendations for the location of the observer ships and other landing craft."

Scientist Warns Of Future Wars

MISSOULA, Mont., Feb. 20 (AP)—Dr. Harold C. Urey, famed scientist who contributed to development of the atomic bomb with his discovery of "heavy" water, predicted here last night the next world war would be fought in the sky.

Dr. Urey, a 42-year-old man, was speaking at the Missoula Chamber of Commerce, emphasizing that the only solution "here seen" was the United Nations to outlaw war and warned "we will only know when the war has started when atomic bombs explode in the sky with a blinding flash."

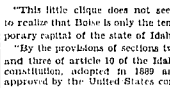
